## From the Principal

High Talent
Congratulations to our members of the NSW State Schools Instrumental ensembles ( Jason Kok, James Mackay (Year 11) and Alasdair Brown (Year 9), who performed at the first concert hosted by the Performing Arts Unit. Newcomer Oliver Konakoff (Year 11) was selected in the CHS Volleyball team to compete in the Trans Tasman tournament. Well done!

## Student Awards Scheme

Mr Beringer presented an informative power point display to students in Years 7 and 8. His aim was to demystify the scheme and to inspire greater participation by our younger students. His intervention is timely because half and full categories can be satisfied towards the end of term one by: attending the Head of the River (at least 200 boys did so); participating in the athletics carnival and running in the cross-country event. The scheme really just recognises the things we expect you to do anyway. To get a medallion you need to do a bit more than what would be expected. I am confident that more boys in stage 4 will appreciate that attaining the categories for medals is well within their reach if they get involved fully in school life.

## Behaviour at Bus Stops and on

 Buses about our students "congregating and sitting on the temporary barriers (on the out bound stop) situated on the Moore Park Bus Roadway". Obviously, such behaviour is unsafe and poses a risk of injury from barriers toppling over. Bus drivers have raised this matter as a safety concern and I
want to encourage users of Anzac Parade buses to take heed of this warning to wait for buses in appropriate places and to refrain from engaging in dangerous behaviour. In the last six years two of our boys have been hit by vehicles on roadways adjacent to our school.

## Mixed Fortunes for our Rowers in Their Long Finale to the Season



Our crews were literally blown out of the water on a blustery Head of the River Saturday which saw the slowest winning time for the first VIII in more than eight years. The cross headwind favoured lane 2 and made lanes 8 and 9 hard going indeed. I noticed that all our crews kept their form and were trying to make good strokes together, right up to the finish line. I felt that it was a good sign that our boys know how to row but were a bit overwhelmed by the conditions. The best row of the day came from the first VIII, the only crew to reach the first school benchmark of $<10 \%$ off the pace. At $8.28 \%$ off the pace they were followed by the $2^{\text {nd }}$ Year 10 VIII (10.2\%) and the first Year 10 VIII (13.9\%). Our crews can take heart from the fact that the $10 \%$ barrier is well within their reach if they persist in off season strength and fitness work. The support from our school was unprecedented and very much appreciated on the day.

At the CHS regatta on Tuesday, High rowers came into their own against more "normal" opposition. The first and second VIII had a leisurely row against each other in a time nearly 7 seconds faster than their Head of the River result. Most boys backed up for several more rows. A clean sweep in the championship men's quad sculls was a highlight for me, seeing only High boys on the podium. From the 15 races for boys contested High was unplaced in only 3 events. High crews won 20
medals: 7 gold, 6 silver and 7 bronze. Tom Hurrell won two team gold medals and a bronze in single sculls to cap off a big day. High regained its champion school trophy by narrowly winning the point score, despite not being able to contest races for girls as the co-ed schools can. The coaching staff and logistics crew did a great job as usual to get so many of the same boys to the start line in a variety of craft. Pairs and double sculls are not boats we are used to handling. Our junior crews had trouble staying in their lanes without coxswains but did well with a minimum of training.

## Service Learning - the Latest Curriculum

 Addition?A couple of Federal MPs are pushing the imported 'service learning' concept. In USA schools students have to do a service project as part of their High School diploma exiting credential. Our community is ahead of the game with its Student Awards Scheme and Charities Committee and Plan. However, we are still lagging in the area of structured help to community institutions. It would be great to see High boys helping out at one of the community service delivery agencies or aged care facilities. Such activity would be credited in the "additional information" section of the Awards Scheme booklet. High needs to develop its profile as a local community school. We have Surry Hills, Paddington, Green Square and Victoria Park as adjacent housing areas. We need to seek out connections with local institutions.

In this week's High Notes a pamphlet has been inserted asking for donations towards the completion of the first stage of the project by May 29. Parking coordinator still required. Half of the days have already been accrued. Ideally parent/s from the lower age groups to take on the task.

First aid at McKay/MPW is being coordinated by HT Sport. A medical person for each age group is
required for immediate on field attention. Each age group is encouraged to canvass their parents for someone to fill this role. Possibly on a rotation basis.

## Sydney High 2 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$ Annual Basketball Dinner

On Friday $31^{\text {st }}$ of March, High had its $2^{\text {nd }}$ annual basketball dinner to congratulate the improvements achieved during the past two seasons and to thank all the efforts placed in by everyone. It was a great place to be at and a great sight to see, that our great hall was filled with so many students, parents, coaches and staff. To add to that, the significance of all of us being enthusiastic about basketball and supporting High is important. Speeches were made by coaches and staff, commenting about the continuing success in High basketball and awarding the players who proved themselves to their teams. I urge all our basketball players to attend next year (or compete for entry) to celebrate for our achievements and to continue our support. We had over 200 in attendance this year! Our school has improved by $4 \%$ in terms of wins. The 'A' grade teams who everyone wants to play for have improved from $28 \%$ wins last season to $53 \%$ wins this season.

## Extracts from Francis Wong's reply on behalf of the students.

It's hard to believe that I'm standing here now, at the end of my High basketball career, having represented the school in almost 100 games. For many of us in our senior years, these few years have brought many highs and lows, and for the younger boys, many great experiences are sure to follow.

## ATHLETICS 2006

## Pre Season Information for Athletes and their Parents

The Athletics season is approaching and the following is intended to assist boys and their families make decisions about participation.

- All boys should be involved in the School Athletics Carnival held at Sydney Athletic Field (Kensington) on Wednesday April $12^{\text {th }}$ (all day) and Thursday April $13^{\text {th }}$ (half day).
- Some of the participants at the School Carnival will qualify to compete in the Combined High School (CHS) competitions through Zone, Area and State Carnivals.
- Some boys will choose to participate in the prestigious GPS Athletics competition which begins on Saturday $19^{\text {th }}$ August and concludes with the GPS Athletics Championships on Saturday $16^{\text {th }}$ September.


## G.P.S. Athletics

This is easily the best school Athletics competition in Australia. Championship Day attracts a much bigger crowd than professional Grand Prix Carnivals!

Athletics has a unique position in the G.P.S. Sporting calendar, as competition occurs between the Winter season and Summer season. It is an autumn sport! The season is short, but intense, and the boys involved always seem to enjoy the experience. Boys (and parents) considering Athletics in 2006 should be aware of the following points....

- Sprint training and Shot Put training for Athletics is held at lunch times at the school on Tuesdays and longer distance training is held after school on the same day.
- Athletics does not continue as a regular sport after the GPS Championships - September $16^{\text {th }}$.
- Boys are expected to take some responsibility for their own training outside these times.
- Boys are expected to compete in at least 3 Invitational Carnivals to be eligible for selection in the Championship team.
- High will co-host an Invitational with Scots this year at the E.S. Marks Field, Kensington on Saturday September $9^{\text {th }}$.

The School Carnival: E.S. Marks Field - Kensington (Wednesday \& Thursday April $12^{\text {th }} \& 13^{\text {th }}$ )

## Aims of the Carnival

- Promote maximum student participation
- Promote fair competition between athletes and houses
- Promote a sense of pride in the achievements of fellow athletes and the school community.


## Banned Items \& Activities

- Normal school rules apply
- No footballs or Frisbees on the days of the carnival
- Do not take valuables to this event, as theft at the carnival is a common occurrence
- Athletes are not allowed to run in bare feet


## House Rules \& Events

- Athletes must run in a least two track events and participate in one field event for the Student Award Scheme.
- Athletes will go to their designated area on the days of the carnival for roll call.
- Athletes will be seated in their designated area before and during roll call. Roll call teachers will not start roll call until everyone is seated.
- Roll call classes will sit in lines - year 7 closest to the track, moving in ascending order up to year 12 at the back of the stands.
- Athletes must come to the carnival in house colours or athletic singlets. All athletes must run in house colours. No house colours, no house point. One point will be allocated for each student in house SHIRTS OR ATHLETIC SINGLETS.
- House captains and vice-captains will be asked to organise their respective houses for formal events during the day.

Point score: Points will be awarded for the following places.
$1^{\text {st }}-10 \mathrm{pts}, 2^{\text {nd }}-8 \mathrm{pts}, 3^{\text {rd }}-6$ pts, $4^{\text {th }}-4$ pts, $5^{\text {th }}-2$ pts, $6^{\text {th }}$ and all finishers -1 pts. Double points for relays Age Champions: The athlete with the most points in any Age Group will be declared the Age Champion. Champion House: The house with the most points will be declared the Champion House.
Age Groups: An athlete ceases to be under 14 on the $31^{\text {st }}$ December of the year in which he reaches the age of 14 years.
School Team: The school athletics team to compete at the GPS and CHS competition will be selected on the basis of performances at the school carnival, training sessions and the GPS invitational carnivals.
Lane Draws: Will be determined by Marshals for all Heats and Heat Finals. Lane draws for Semi-Finals and Finals will be based on times and announced by the Recorders.
100m Heats/Semi/Finals: The fastest 16 competitors will contest the Semi-Finals. The Fastest 8 will progress to the finals. No points will be awarded for places in Heats or Semis - entry points only.
200m Heats/Finals: The fastest 8 will progress to the Finals. No points will be awarded for placing in the Heats.
1500m, 800m, 400m Heat/Finals: These will be conducted as Heat Finals. Where there is more than one heat, placing will be determined on times. Athletes are advised to run these races to the clock as Heat speed may vary.

Relays: House relays will be conducted as $4 \times 100 \mathrm{~m}$. House captains and vice-captains are asked to organise the house relays well in advance of the scheduled start.
