



## From the Principal High Talent

Congratulations to Charley Peng, our High Chess champion 2006. Belated congratulations to Phillip Kurts for his second place in the NSW Sabot championships. Dominic Bowes has been awarded the Lily Gunther Trophy for Best Debater in the Junior State Debating Championships. Well done, Dominic! Michael Coutts won this award last year, following Oscar Maclaren (1998), demonstrating the strength of High debating at state level.

## Corridor Behaviour

It has come to my attention that instances of pushing and shoving are occurring in corridors affecting junior boys particularly. In some cases it might be just impatient older boys not respecting the rights of younger ones and being bullies. In others there may be congestion and contributing factors caused by junior boys themselves. Corridors need to be kept clear. Boys should not be sitting down in corridors blocking the transit of others. Boys lining up outside rooms ought to remain in line and not form groups, obstructing the corridor. School bags are not to be left in corridors obstructing traffic. The rule about moving through corridors is simple – keep to your left. This is also true of stairs. When we cooperate with one another there is no problem.

Staff members are asked to step to the door of their classrooms between periods to monitor corridor traffic. Staff in staffrooms are asked to respond to noises of students running in corridors or any sounds of pushing or affray. Occupational Health and Safety is everyone's responsibility. Students who have been harassed or pushed in corridors are urged to report the incident to a teacher.

## High Chess



Thank you to the 120 boys who stepped up to challenge for the High championship of Chess. The interest in this activity is growing rapidly. Organisers Alex Feldman and Mr Harvey had

to limit competitors to 60. The event was well conducted and transparently scored. Other accomplished players apart from Charley were runners up Dawen Shi and Edward Lu. Thank you to assistants Jason Cohn and Steven Zheng who helped out rather than competing. Chess is in good hands as we look forward to 2007 as the holders of the NSW Junior Chess League trophy board for School Junior Chess. This trophy has been awarded since 1979 and High has won it only once before in 1991. Thank you again to Mr Harvey, Alex and the Chess Committee for their effort to inspire a resurgence of Chess at High this year.

## School Uniform Policy



Students must wear full school uniform in a full uniform school. The SRC and the P & C recommend policy on school uniform to the Principal. No one has asked me to alter the policy. We need to enforce it. When I ask boys to tuck in shirts and do up ties to the throat or do up collar buttons, they comply most willingly. My sense is that they all know what the correct dress code is but choose to test staff resolve at every opportunity. Boys with this attitude ought not to go unchecked. Insist on correct dress code from boys entering classes. Self-discipline needs to be practised. William James astutely observed: 'The greatest discovery of any generation is that a human being can alter his life by altering his attitude'. Let us not complain about declining standards of school dress, let us do something to make conformity commonplace.

## Electronic Devices at School

'Discman' or 'i-pod' devices have not been banned at High as they have in many schools. We understand students might want to be entertained while commuting or waiting for or between events / lessons / appointments. Nevertheless, restrictions apply. Junior students are not to bring these devices to school. They are prone to being left lying around, or to being stolen or damaged. Seniors may bring these devices to school entirely at their own risk. Teachers

may confiscate devices being listened to, watched or manipulated during class time. Teachers do not accept responsibility for the safety of these items. High does not ban mobiles. We know boys do many things after hours and need to be able to contact their families and friends. Again, the school is being reasonable but has restrictions. Mobile phones have to be switched off during class time. Teachers may confiscate mobiles activated in class. Students in class with headphones on will be assumed to be breaking the rule. These rules are clearly stated in the School Diary 2006. Let us all cooperate to abide by them.

### Year 7 and 8 State Debating Championships

The Premiers Debating Challenge (PDC) is conducted each year by the NSW DET's Performing Arts Unit. The Years 7 and 8 competition is called the Teasdale Cup and this year the 8A GPS Debating team, consisting of Antony Paul, Maxwell Phillis, Puneet Baweja and John Aclis, won their regional final and attended the 3 day State Debating Championships held on a camp at Sydney University.

According to the results of the debates:

- Every student should be given a laptop,
- MP3 players should be banned at our schools,
- Cars should not be banned in our cities, and
- Compulsory voting is not true democracy.

The 8As qualified for the competition by winning the Sydney Region of the Premier's Debating challenge, which had been running for the past month or so.

The ten teams at the State competition were divided into two pools of five, for a round robin. The top two teams from each pool qualified for the semi finals. The 8As won three of their four debates, losing their first debate on an unlucky technicality. This meant that they were tied with two other teams each with three out of four wins – the team from Western Sydney (Baulkham Hills), and the team from Hunter Central Coast (Maitland Grossman). As a countback of who beat whom didn't resolve anything, the adjudicators held a meeting to choose the top two teams. The 8As were not chosen, as the adjudicators felt that although the 8As had by far the most potential, they had not yet proven themselves through what they had presented so far.

The eventual winners were Baulkham Hills High, representing Western Sydney, even though the 8As beat them in the round robin. The final debate was "that military intervention should be used against North Korea". Quite a tricky topic for a bunch of 13/14 year olds!

At the camp, the 8As met new people, some of whom were female, played a lot of giant chess in their recreational time and had quite an intensive debating learning experience, identifying a lot of areas of improvement for next season. One team member even managed to contract some sort of nasty allergy to the food. It was a great experience, and three days off school.

Thanks to Mr Webb and Miss Brewer for "minding" us at camp and the adjudicators Hamish, Julia, Amy and Alison for their great feedback.

# New Library & Performing Arts Centre

## Tax Deductible 125th Anniversary Project



Sydney Boys High School depends upon its community of parents, Old Boys and supporters to further the School's ethos of the pursuit of all-round excellence.

We have a bold vision for a two stage Library & Performing Arts Centre. With advances in information technology, there is a pressing need to create a facility which is able to adapt and keep pace with meeting the increasing needs of our students. The estimated cost of the combined project is \$4m. Stage one requires \$1.8m; we have \$400k. A new **tax deductible** monthly giving program has been introduced to help fund our development goal.

We have implemented an arrangement with ANZ Bank for automatic monthly deductions from a nominated credit card. You can elect to give \$50, \$40, \$30 or \$20 each month for a period of twelve months. Your nominated amount, along with your name and credit card details will be sent to the bank electronically. At the end of the financial year, the school will issue an annual statement as evidence of tax deductible donations. You can opt in or out of the scheme provided you notify the school in writing five working days before the fifteenth day of each month.






