Parking Levy for 2008



TheBuildingFundAdvisoryGrouprecommended to the P& C that in order toincrease the tempo of

fundraising for the new library that the tax on > \$500 parking event collections should rise to 35%. The P & C has recently ratified that change to operate from December 1, 2007. The school pays for management of the Parking operation and the wages of a part time groundsman from its share of the tax proceeds. It was recommended by the BFAG that the distribution of the tax should be amended. The P & C has ratified the proposal- School 55%, P & C 45%. The new distribution of the tax will commence from the first parking event in December. We hope that the new arrangements will yield \$20,000 per annum towards the new library.

Prefect Elections

The poll for the election of School Prefects has been declared. I congratulate all those successful students. The Electoral College

system of voting worked very well again this year. Prefect 2007 votes (34) + staff votes (71 x 2) combined for 176 votes, Year 10 (160 votes) and Year 11 (181 votes). Each voter could vote for up to 20 candidates on the ballot paper. Not all voters did so. There were a few informal votes (more than 20 candidates selected or none). I urge all students and staff to continue to value this democratic opportunity to elect school leaders. As happens in every election process, many qualified and worthy people miss out on election. My commiserations go to them. It is hard to be disappointed after contributing a lot to your school. Democracy is messy and confronting but the fairest process humanity has yet devised to discover the will of large numbers of people.

Volunteer Career Management



We have many volunteers working for us at High – coaches, managers, committee members, helpers. Many are Old Boys. We do

not have any system of documentation or logging of what volunteers have done over the years. University students can now get recognition on a parallel exiting testamur, indicating what non-academic accomplishments they have had while at university. We ought to have a central register of volunteers and their duties/services.

Certificates of recognition of what individuals have done could be issued. More importance could be paid to their contribution by: honouring of volunteers at assemblies, publication of volunteer histories of service at or for the school, profiling current volunteers in High Flyer and High Bulletin, and holding occasions aimed more social at acknowledging the essential contributions that volunteers make to the operations and governance of this school. A small committee could ensure the recording and recognising of volunteer activity. School Assistants can maintain the records. I am asking for help from an interested parent and Old Boy to formalise this process.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that the Court of Appeal, which forms part of the Supreme Court, is the highest civil court in NSW and hears appeals from the Supreme Court, the Land and Environment Court, District Court and some tribunals. Created in 1966, it consists of the Chief Justice, the President of the Court of Appeal and nine Judges of Appeal. Seven members of the Court of Appeal have attended Sydney High. The first were **Gordon Wallace** (1915) and **Bernard Sugerman** (1920) who were both appointed in 1966. Wallace was first President of the Court 1966-1970 and Sugerman was President 1970-1972. The most recent old boy to be a member of the Court, apart from the Chief Justice **James Spigelman** (1962), was **Paul Stein** (1956) who retired in 2003.

In 1976, Josef joined the Symphony Orchestra in Baden-Baden Germany and from 1979 to 2001 he was lecturer of oboe at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. He has made several appearances as a soloist and played in chamber music groups throughout Australia and overseas including Europe, Asia and South Africa. Josef is currently teaching, adjudicating and performing both as a soloist and in ensembles.
