Parent-Teacher Interview statistics



computerised Our booking system for the three Parent Teacher nights held towards the end of last term threw up some

interesting statistics. Registered parents requesting interviews: Year 7, 69%; Years 8-9, 58%; Years 10-12, 51%. Number of interviews allocated: Year 7, 683: Years 8-9. 1137; Years 10-12, 1463. Interviews unable to be scheduled: Year 7, 131, Years 8-9, 158; Years 10-12, 2. Average interviews per student: Year 7, 5.5; Years 8-9, 5.1; Years 10-12, 4.6. [Year 7 boys can have 10-12 teachers, whereas as Year 12 boys may have as few as 4]. Average parent congestion (average number of parents waiting on site): Year 7, 6.6; Years 8-9, 18.5; Years 10-12, 13.4. Average parent time waste between interviews: Year 7, 0:11; Years 8-9, 0:17; Years 10-12, 0:11. Teacher average time waste across all teachers and all time slots available: Year 7, O:19; Years 8-9, 0:20; Years 10-12, 0:44. We are constantly trying to make the process more effective and efficient. I urge parents to try to make the time available to talk to teachers about their son's progress next year. We have unused capacity and only 60% of parents involved.

Ausgrid Surry Hills to Rose Bay cable project



Ausgrid is installing 132,000 volt underground electricity cables between Surry Hills and Rose Bay. The project has commenced and will take a year to

complete. The route passing near High and its areas of access takes in Albion Street, Anzac Parade, Driver Avenue, Lang Road, Grand Drive, Birrell Street, Denison Street and Ebley Street.. Work will take place between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 8 am to 1pm Saturday. There will be road closures and disruptions to traffic flow in these areas during the next 6 months at least. Twenty old toilets were replaced with new ones – hopefully our water consumption will be reduced further as a result of more efficient cisterns.

SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORT SCHEME (SSTS)

School Student Code of Conduct – Students travelling on buses must:-

During 2011, authorised officers will be deployed to inspect **Code of Conduct** compliance on school bus services in the Eastern Region. Students who are found to have breached their obligations may lose their travel entitlement and possibly incur an infringement.
