The most impressive feature of the charity is its administrative costs - less than 1% of funds raised. This statistic illustrates the very high level of volunteer time that makes the charity so effective. Letters Re Absence/Lateness/ Early Leave



When your son returns to school from being absent he is required to provide a letter of explanation signed by a parent or quardian. If your son

is going to be late for school a note is also required. Alternatively you may contact the school by phone on 9662 9300 and dial "1" for the absentee line.

If your son has an early leave note he is required to have his note signed by either Mr Barris, Mr Dowdell or Mr Prorellis **before 8:55 am** and handed in to the Main Office immediately after. Each letter should be signed by a parent or guardian with the <u>name</u>, <u>date</u> and <u>roll class</u> of your son <u>printed clearly</u>. Your son needs to pick up a leave pass from the Main Office before he leaves the school.

Leave

If you require leave for your son please, apply in writing and address your application to the Principal, Dr Jaggar, stating the reason and length of time of the leave. Your son must then present this application to Dr Jaggar for permission for the leave. Please remember to apply before the leave and not after.

The Principal must approve all leave applications.



Summary of Sports Policy and Follow up Procedures

Summer sport selections have taken place. Ensure you fully understand what is expected of you if you sign up to a Saturday AAGPS sport. The full sports policy is on the schools website under the 'Sports' dropdown menu

- If you sign up to a sport you are expected to commit to that sport for the whole season
- All students are to nominate via the online system for the sport and your preferred team; however, final team selections will be subject to selection trials.
- If you select a Saturday AAGPS sport- and you are successful in making a team you are expected to attend all of the training session
 - o A/B teams- 3 training sessions a week (including 1 sport session)
 - o C/D/E/F teams- 2 training sessions a week (including 1 sport session)
 - o All other sports- 2 training sessions a week (including 1 sport session)
 - o Weights/Sprints etc are counted as a session
 - The MIC of your sport will inform you of when/where your training sessions are. This
 information will also be in your student portal
- Saturday Absence- If you are absent from Saturday due to a legitimate reason:
 - o If you know ahead of time-speak to the MIC of your sport and tell your coach
 - o Go to student portal and submit that you will be absent in the week leading up to the match
 - o or a minimum of one hour before your game starts on a Saturday
 - o Follow this up with a note from your parent/doctor explaining the absence
 - o Put the note inside the 'Saturday Absences' box outside the PDHPE office by 9am sharp on the following Monday morning
 - o Make sure the note has your full name, roll class and dates for your absence
- Training absence- if you are absent from a training session
 - o Bring a note and place it in the 'Training Absences' box outside the PDHPE office by 9am the next day you are at school.
 - o What if you are injured/sick over a longer period of time? Ensure the note has the full and accurate details on it including your name, roll class, start date & finish date for the absence.
- Training days
 - Most training sessions outside of school hours will occur on a Monday, Wednesday (years 7-9) and Thursday (Years 10-12) afternoons. Ensure you make these times available for your team training sessions.

GPS 2nds Report

Friday at Olympic Park came and went, as did our Saturday match against Grammar. They were two disappointing days and it was a shame to end the season on such a low after soaring so high for so long.

With Seconds broken up into a number of separate teams, SBHS C at Olympic Park on Friday faced the tournament without a traditional setter. The best we had were Thomas and myself. Thomas nominated me. While my setting wasn't too jarring, the largest issue was of consistency and of my tendency to step away from the net while setting, meaning I was setting on an awkward angle. Despite this and the lack of time for our outside and middle hitters to adjust to my style, we succeeded in our match against Cabramatta 2-0, with convincing set scores of 25-15, 25-21. However while we were fuelled by this early victory, our success was not to last. Our next match against Rooty Hill began with a very worrisome loss in the first set, 10-25. While we picked up our game and fought back in the second set, it was still not enough to reclaim what we had lost, and we lost that set too, 21-25. We thought we had our final match against Punchbowl in the bag, but were met with surprise when they took the first set and won, with us down 24-26. While we may have finished the second set with a greater than 2 point lead in the end, the timer went at 20-20 in the second set, with Punchbowl winning by default. It was an unfortunate end to the day, with that being our final match.

Having beat Grammar in our previous match against them, we were eager for another win and to solidify an undefeated GPS status. However despite being at home, we were unprepared despite having the whole team together again after Friday for the level of play and the audience Grammar would bring with them. Despite being up in the first set, Grammar fought back, managing to take the lead themselves and win the first set 21-25. Our serve accuracy was down, as was our communication levels, and our game was suffering as a result. Grammar expertly defended against every one of our balls that wasn't a spike: effectively turning even the best tip to the back corners into a free ball to use to their advantage. While the second set was closely fought, Grammar took it to the end once more, 20-25. We were down 2-0, and the pressure was on. We played better in the third set, tactically tipping it to the setter or just long of him when forced to, taking advantage of their discovered weakness in covering that area. However while this proved to be successful and our serving and communication had been raised once more, ultimately it was not enough, and we lost the third set 23-25. While it was unfortunate to have lost our undefeated status, Grammar did deserve to win with the level of volleyball they were playing on Saturday. Despite this, we were consoled and were pleased in the knowledge that we were still the GPS Premiers given Grammar's loss of two matches compared to our one.


