Year 12 Farewell Assembly


My speech to the Year 12 cohort at their final assembly is reprinted below.

Good afternoon Year 12, parents, students and staff. Welcome to our Farewell Assembly for the Class of 2017. It is with a mixture of pride and sadness that the High staff and I can host your visit to the school today to participate in our annual celebration. We are proud of our graduates for what they accomplished and sad that this is the last time we will see them all together as a cohort of students. The Class of 2017 will be remembered for the video that sparked so much interest in a male-as-female perspective on women's issues. It has been a cohort that should be proud of its undoubted achievements in a range of co-curricular activities. I have listed the most significant of these in my 'Principal's Message' contained in your program. Missing in your program is the historical 'threepeat' by our undefeated first grade GPS debaters as Champions, retaining the Routledge Louat Shield for the third time. Such an achievement is unprecedented in High debating.



Whether in sports, community service, music, chess, social justice, debating or public speaking, participation is our key cultural message. The Class of 2017 certainly did participate. I thank each one of you for that.

We have had promoted our distinctive ethos through the slogan – 'You can't buy spirit'. The implied strength of our sporting culture is in its belief in mutual support and group perseverance in adversity. In my Principal's message in your program, I referenced the timeless *Meditations* by Emperor Marcus Aurelius. BOGGABILLA CULTURAL EXCHANGE



Dear Parent/Guardian,

A group of 20 students will be selected to go to Boggabilla Central School from Sunday 15 until Wednesday 18 October 2017. This trip builds on the long-standing, incredible relationship Sydney Boys High School has with the Boggabilla community.

The excursion is planned to support Aboriginal Culture and Understanding within the NSW Syllabus and is tied in with the community service activities of the school. In mid-June this year, the students from Boggabilla Central School came to Sydney Boys High so students involved in their billeting will be given preference to be included in this excursion.

The idea of the trip is as an exchange so anybody travelling to Boggabilla who has not billeted before will be expected to return the hospitality on the return visit next year unless there are extenuating circumstances.

The group will depart from school at 8am on Sunday 15 October and will return to the school on Wednesday 18 October at the Cleveland St Entrance at approximately 8pm. N.B. This time may vary and should be confirmed with the boys on the return leg.

All travel will be by the school mini-bus. The following is the general plan of events for the trip:

eBirds and iBees; 'The Talk' in the 21st Century

Talking about sex has never been easy, but in an age where young people are getting 'the birds and the bees' from pornography, it has also never been so important. This talk for parents will discuss from a young person's perspective what the real issues with pornography consumption are, introduce a framework for tackling it, and provide some immediately implementable ideas for how to engage your children in such a taboo area. It is being run in conjunction with a workshop for Year 8 students, but is open to all parents.

Taking Porn out from Beneath the Covers

Online pornography is now mainstream - not only is the average age of first exposure thought to be around 11 years old, but 'pornification' has spread to Hollywood, music videos, and even the adverts at our local bus stops. The workshop being delivered to Year 8 students breaks the taboo around pornography and equips participants with the skills to identify the most damaging aspects of the normalisation of pornography - body image issues, problematic gender roles, 'sexpectations', and addiction - and how we can move forward to building positive relationships and identities.

2 Birds 1 Bee is a youth-run relationships and sex education organisation founded by Matthew Friedman. It uses workshops to provide educational content and break down conversation taboos.


