High and SHSOBU

I recently wrote to Joseph Waugh, President of the Sydney High School Old Boys Union, informing him that the school would no longer accept payments in trust from families of advanced 'life membership' contributions. The lines of communication concerning who has paid and how many times are very difficult to

sustain between the school and the OBU. The system appears to absolve the OBU from accountability to its prospective members by having the school collect its student money for it. The school will give wholehearted support to any system the OBU might devise for collecting contributions directly. I have offered publicity opportunities, a presence at school events, clerical support and promotion by the school. Mr Waugh has established a committee of Old Boys very familiar with the student life membership scheme to sort out the contentious issue of qualification for life membership for students leaving the school in the last few years and to propose a model for the future that clearly establishes what it is that people are paying for. In the meantime, Mr Waugh and his Executive are busily trying to reconnect with the OBU membership via ebulletins, the distribution of High Flyer and the reinstatement of *High Bulletin* as a periodical.

In the second half of the year the OBU will be in a position to accept payments from new and existing members of the scheme and will make contact with all known stakeholders with current contact details.

GPS Heads Meeting

High hosted the GPS Heads for the first meeting of 2007. The Heads held firm in their decision to move the athletics season for 2008 back to where it used to be - in between summer and winter sports. I remain ambivalent about this because of the problem of the Trial HSC occurring while GPS competition is still ongoing. On the other hand, properly preparing teams for the rigours of GPS competition is facilitated by having the extra time that the athletics season provides for coaches and players. Consequently, I no longer object to the switch back. The Heads acknowledged this was a "significant decision" to go it alone.

Several models were tabled about how the seasons of athletics and rugby would run. There is no immediate likelihood that CAS schools will change back so the issue of traditional fixtures and trial games is a concern. Dialogue with ISA and CAS Heads was recommended. It was also recommended

that May 17 should be booked for the Athletics carnival in 2008.

It was agreed that the Head of the River regatta will be held on Wednesday, 19th March, 2008. The Heads are seeking advice from the AAGPS on the timing of the races on that day. The rugby arrangement with St Gregory's College is to extend to the 2007 season.

End of Term

Given the disruptions that have occurred at the beginning and during term, our curriculum and programs were still delivered effectively. I thank all staff members, students, coaches and parents for their commitment to achievement at Sydney High. I wish everyone a well deserved break.

Term 1 has been a very busy creative term. First off the Art staff extend a warm welcome to Mrs Jocelyne Isaacs who has recently joined the Visual Arts staff.

The Year 8 excursion to the Art Gallery of NSW and the Gardens was a great success and will become a permanent fixture on the art calendar. A big thanks to the students who behaved in an exemplary fashion and all of the teachers who assisted. Students saw the Archibald, Sulman and Wynne Prizes, the Manga exhibition displaying the master Tezuka's work [of Kimba and Astro Boy fame] and Art Express. With an hour in each show it was a pretty long time without a break and the boys handled this with admirable control, remaining on task.

The Study day and exhibition viewing at the AGNSW for Years 9 to 12 Visual Arts students was excellent. The lecturer articulately explained the cultural background to Tezuka's "Astro Boy" and "Kimba" providing excellent comparisons to the American Superhero of the same era and enlightening students about the impact devastation and loss had on the psyche of the Japanese after the atom bomb.

Year 10 Art students have been producing small scale sculptures in a range of materials exploring the different starting points and catalysts for artists. They are now working on an individual work in their choice of materials that expresses movement and rhythm. The work being produced is varied from a chandelier made

from agapanthus flowers to constructions out of found objects to carved hebel or modelled clay

Years 10 and 12 have been to College of Fine Arts to view Art Express works at that venue and look through the VAPDs of strong Art students. Year 12 returned feeling confident and reinspired. The excursion to the AGNSW on the 27th further reinforced the necessity to JUST get started and allow their body of work to take shape and to take risks with techniques. I have every confidence that this year's art HSC students will produce some amazing work.

Two Year 10 students, Shane Ponraj and Neil Street, attended a Gifted and Talented art workshop "Rocks On" and met Ben Quilty, artist recently featured in Spectrum, who judged the works and selected works to be exhibited. Congratulations to Shane for his Highly Commended award and first artist group show which opens on the 28th March in the city.

Year 11 Digital Imaging students have mastered PhotoShop and the digital camera and have produced their first portfolio of 10 photographs. These will be exhibited in the last few weeks of term in the main foyer.

Year 9 art students have launched into a study of The Body in Art. They have begun to investigate how the human figure is represented in traditional and contemporary art practices. In historical studies students are learning about style characteristics and ideas about beauty, death, changing values, identity, transformation and their world. In artmaking students are developing their skills in drawing using a range of materials including ink, progresso, charcoal, pastels and oil paint sticks. The focus for their drawing task is to experiment with materials and develop techniques whilst exploring ideas of scale and proportion in the ideal human figure.

The theme for Year 7 Art students is Fears and Fantasies. Students have recently been given their first art assignment. Their progress/interim reports will be completed by teachers as they mark these assignments.

Letters Re Absence/Lateness/ Early Leave



When your son returns to school from being absent he is required to provide a letter of explanation signed by a parent or guardian. If your son is going to be late for school a note is also required.

If your son has an early leave note he is required to have his note signed by either Mr Beringer, Mr Dowdell or Mr Prorellis **before 8:55 am** and handed in to the Main Office immediately after. Each letter should be signed by a parent or quardian with the name date and roll class of your son <u>printed clearly</u>. Your son needs to pick up a leave pass from the Main Office before he leaves the school.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Paul Pearce (1973), who was returned as member for Coogee in last weekend's election, is one of 22 old boys of Sydney High to have held a seat in the NSW Parliament? The first was Rev Thomas Simpson Crawford (c 1890) who was elected as Labor member for Marrickville in 1910. Four old boys have held NSW Cabinet posts: Alwyn Tonking (c 1905) was Colonial Secretary 1939-1941; Rev John Mason (1945) was Minister for Lands and Forests 1975-1976; Paul Landa (1958) held numerous posts including Minister for Education 1980-1981 and Attorney General 1983-1984; and Peter Anderson (1964) was, amongst other appointments, Minister for Police and Emergency Services 1981-1986. John Mason was also Leader of the Opposition (Liberal) 1978-1981.

NEW TRAINING VENUES! ATHLETICS AND CROSS COUNTRY 2007!

All you medium and long distance runners who want to run GPS Athletics, or train for Cross Country, we have a couple of training options available for you this year. NOTE THE NEW VENUES! It's highly recommended that you do some training now. You'll be fitter and more competitive come GPS, and you'll be more likely to make the GPS team.

Training will be with accomplished coach Sean Williams (www.sweatsydney.com.au) who takes a squad of competitive athletes at either McKay or Queens Park. He will give you a program and guide you with your training. I myself have trained with Sean while at school and since and can vouch for his effectiveness.

Option 1: For those who are willing to commit to four or five sessions a week, and can run any **one** of these times, come down to squad trainings. The price is \$20 a month. Times are:

Sunday - Long run, meet at 8:00am near McKay.

Option 2: For those who don't want to commit to extended training, but want to do a bit to get some base fitness for the GPS season, come and join the morning sessions at McKay. \$10 a session (discounts apply for multiple sessions), beginning at 6:15am Tuesdays and Thursdays. Along with this you get the Saturday and Sunday sessions above for free.

For either option, just come down to a session and join in, or call Sean or myself for more information. The sooner the better!

Option 3: For those who want to do their own thing, there will be programs and guidelines available from Mr Devlin soon. You should try to make one of the above options but if you can't, please pick up a program to guide your training.


