



**From the Principal
Boggabilla Cultural Exchange**



It was a privilege to be able to visit Boggabilla Central School and to share some of the experiences of the boys from High who made the trip. Aunty Dawn, a Kamillaroi tribal elder, made an eloquent welcome to country speech, thanking us for our interest in their community and hoping that multiculturalism would be promoted by the visit. I was gratified to witness the progress that has been made on the fitting out of the original school building as a community centre for aboriginal elders and leaders to gather to promote their traditional language and culture. I was very pleased to be able to offer Ms Denise Burke, Principal of Boggabilla central School, a cheque for \$2700, being the proceeds of this year's fund raising. Year 9 has the refurbishment of the 'Pink Room' as they call it as the primary goal of its charitable fund raising. The project is moving ahead well and I urge Year 8 boys going into Year 9 in 2008 to recognise how much good their future fundraising can do.

We shared an art lesson where our boys tried their hands as artists in the traditional style, representing people, animals and country with symbols. Several members of the local community cooked us 'johnny cakes' on an open fire. They were a hit with butter and Bundaberg Golden Syrup. The countryside was too wet to travel over so the camping site for Tuesday night had to be changed to a local spot on a bend in the Macintyre River known as 'Bondi' because of its 50 metres of sandy beach. The visit was most enjoyable and High is helping to make a difference in a community with every possible disadvantage to educational and personal growth.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that four old boys of Sydney High have been parliamentary leaders of political parties? **Earle Page** (1895) was leader of the Australian Country Party (now the National Party) in the Commonwealth Parliament, 1920-1939; **John Willcock** (1890) was leader of the Australian Labor Party in Western Australia, 1936-1945; **Jonathan Issacs** (1967) was leader of the Australian Labor Party in the Northern Territory, 1977-1981; and **John Mason** (1945) was leader of the Liberal Party in NSW, 1978-1981. Only two of them became heads of government. **Earle Page** became Prime Minister of Australia for 19 days in April 1939; and **John Willcock** was Premier of Western Australia for the whole period of his leadership.

Athletics Report 18 August 07



The first carnival of the season proved to be quite a good sign for the future of High athletics. With many athletes out due to the senior rugby brunch or HSC trials, the responsibility of representing the school was left to the juniors. Excellent depth was shown in the

13s and 14s age groups. In the 100m, the 13s ran an extra race composed of purely High runners (the first time I've ever seen us outnumber St Ignatius), and the 14s matched Iggies in numbers. The 15s age group let us down in regards to numbers, with only four 100m runners and a sole 200m runner. The 16s also struggled with numbers, however, I am sure this will improve in weeks to come. Good results in the 100m came from Tian Ling (12.89), Slava Reiyder (12.80), Michael Phung (12.32, 3rd in Championship, 25.97 in 200m), Leon Li (12.82), Michael Wong (12.76), Shadman Ali (12.06 3rd in Championship but still got smoked), Josh Tassell (11.53, 2nd in Championship, 23.73 in 200m, 3rd in Championship) and Joel Livingston (12.03). Harrison Lane also performed well in 1500m and 3000m, running 4:40 and winning the 15s 1500m, while coming second in the Opens 3km in a

time of 10:03. All athletes are reminded that they need to go to Mr. Devlin after their events so they can get their times/distances (and if possible, positions) marked down so we know you've attended. 

Guitar Recital





In conjunction with the Robin Anderson Film Awards Festival, a series of lectures has been prepared to provide students with indepth information about the study and practice of cinematography and videography. This course targets English, Drama and Visual Arts students in Stages 4 and 5.

The Cineliteracy and Filmmaking day aims to provide students with an understanding of the specific language and theories that relate to filmmaking. Sessions will include viewing a number of film resources and hearing first hand accounts from key professionals in the film industry. This day will enrich students' knowledge of filmmaking and promote a more critical eye when studying film and video.

The workshop will provide information about the following:

- produce a micro length film the "Super Sweet Short Film" at the end of the workshop
- the basic grammar of film camera work, direction and editing, to enable better articulation of ideas in a dynamic language known as film
- how to add depth to a video through structure and concept development
- pre-production - effective use of a storyboard, floor plan and assembling the production
- the importance of, and some approaches to, script development
- the dynamic discourse of editing and insights into effective editing
- how to refine your filmmaking skills if you are a competent camera operator
- film appreciation - how to use cineliteracy effectively and understand filmmaking


