From the Principal High Talent

Wireless fibre installed

We have had to install optic fibre links from the server room to the main building to service the recently supplied wireless hubs from DET. We have invested \$7k. to support the network. The first stage of our DET wireless network will be activated shortly. This is only stage one of the expansion of wireless capability. We expect most of the school to be wirelessed during phase 2.The down side is that our existing wireless hubs will not be accessible using the new laptops. We are working on establishing compatibility.



Students and parents should not expect that using laptops will change immediately the way teaching and learning

occur at High. Syllabuses, programs, units of work and assessment strategies will gradually reflect the increased capabilities of students to research, retrieve, manipulate and present information. Newly created resources, strategies and approaches to concept and skill development have to be tested and piloted before widespread changes can be attempted. We ask for your patience and understanding as the staff and the students explore the possibilities of the technology available.

Solar Funding Agreement Signed

After a very long wait and several changes in the specifications for the photovoltaic cells, I received and rapidly signed the funding



agreement for the Commonwealth Grant of \$50,000. The P & C has already donated \$10k. towards the project which

will cost \$72k. As soon as the paperwork is cleared I expect to receive the money and we can activate the installation contract. We expect to save >\$1.4k per annum on electricity bills through solar power generation. More importantly, we will have an on-site educational facility to familiarise students with solar energy and its benefits.

Applications for enrolment in 2010



A team of 15 teachers is currently assessing the applications of over 390 students who have expressed a desire to come to High in Years 8-12. Once

the applications have been assessed by three teachers and the scores collated, a meeting is called to review any discrepancies, before a final list of ranked applicants is sent for review to a community representative and the School Education Director. Interviews will start to be scheduled from the end of this week for the next couple of weeks.

Match Reports

1st XI v Riverview Lost 1-3

The build up to this match involved trepidation mixed with patchy knowledge of the stern task ahead in St Ignatius. A top of the table clash at the home of High football (McKay 1) laid the foundation for a mouth watering clash between the who's who of football in the GPS (Ignatius had 8 combined GPS representatives in addition to the convenor of the GPS Football program) and a solid High outfit that continues to perform well against any opposition.

High dominated the early parts of the match with its slick two touch passing game and resolute defence across the paddock. Some neat layoffs from striker Sam Higgins and quick passing on the angle from Harrison Lane and Jarrod Chan caused all sorts of problems for the tall but slow Ignatius defenders.
