SWIMMING SUCCESS





LENNIE BASSER

This stopwatch was presented to Len Basser L.A., B.Sc.Dip.Ed in 1941 by SBHS Athletes and has been donated by Jim Eckert SBHS (L.C., 1952). It is proudly displayed in the main foyer of the school with funding from the Ethel Killip Memorial Art Collection Trust.

Len Basser taught Chemistry at SBHS from 1931 until his retirement in 1959. He was Athletics Master at the school for the twenty eight years. He captured and inspired the eager minds of his students encouraging them to pursue careers in scientific research

The Len Basser Award for Leadership in Science at Sydney University honours the legacy of an outstanding chemistry teacher. Eight of



Basser's students became fellows of the Royal Society, including Lord (Robert) May, a former President of the Society, and Sir John Cornforth, who shared the Nobel Prize for Chemistry in 1975.

NEW HALL KITCHEN AND SCIENCE LABS

High's state of the art science labs!

Under the National BER building program High elected to spend its \$196,000 on expanding and upgrading the kitchen at the rear of the Great Hall. This self managed project was completed on time and to budget. The Raymond Casey bequest contributed the extra \$30,000 needed to complete the project.











As part of a NSW Government program, our seventh science laboratories were refurbished at a cost of \$700,000. The MacDonald Wing laboratories were transformed.


ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

In 2007 the first of a number of honour boards honouring Old Boys who served their country in the armed services or who distinguished themselves in certain fields of endeavour or in community service were commissioned and installed in locations around the school.

On Founders Day 2008, an honour board which is housed in the Killip Wing stairwell was unveiled. The honour board records 58 names of Old Boys who have achieved the distinction of Medals of the Order of Australia (OAM) for service worthy of particular recognition.

After Founders Day 2009, two further honour boards were unveiled to honour Old Boys who have achieved the distinction of Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for service in a particular locality or field of activity or to a particular group. These boards contain a total of 87 names.

A good number of the Old Boys whose names are included on the board were present for the unveiling. It is our intention to commission a further board in 2010 in recognition of Old Boys who have achieved the distinction of the Officer of the Order of Australia (AO). The Officer of the Order of Australia is awarded for distinguished service of a high degree to Australia or humanity at large.

SHAVE FOR A CURE



WATER POLO

The sport of Water polo is being rebuilt at Sydney High. At the beginning of 2008, Brendan Hancock became our first ever 'water polo import', entering year 9 with a hope of breathing new life into the sport. Later that year, after watching international athletes compete during the Beijing Olympics, more and more of us began to really consider trying this new and exciting sport and today, the overflowing Opens and U16s teams can tell you from experience what really goes on in a water polo match.

Basically, there are 4 intense quarters. A player uses one leg to tread water/ push off another player (if the referee isn't looking), one leg to stop his opponent sinking him (a fairly common practice), one arm to receive, pass, fake and shoot the wet ball, leaving one arm and occasionally a few spare toes to swim. The result: a heart-stopping sports contest with competitors giving every last ounce of physical and mental strength and endurance, never knowing what the bottom of the pool feels like.
