From the Principal **High Talent**

Electricity Sub-Station



Despite long delays already, connection of underground cable from our site with its switches and

substation to the main supply across Cleveland St., is still not yet complete. The plan to use an underbore method to cross the street did not succeed due to unforeseen subterranean obstructions. The revised plan is to block off the road and cut a trench to accommodate the high capacity cable to our site. The catch is that the high density cable they need is out of stock until December. It looks as though our improved power supply will not be forthcoming until 2011! Your patience is appreciated.

The Phillip Day Memorial Scholarship

High has only one scholarship and you have to qualify for entry before you are eligible to apply. All boys currently enrolled or enrolling in 2011 are eligible. The scholarship is valued at \$1200. Scholarship. An application form can be downloaded from the icon next to Phil Day's picture. The criteria could apply to a number of different kinds of applicants. "The Scholarship Committee may give preference to a highly talented student in a particular area of academic and/or co-curricular endeavour and/or to a particularly good all round achiever and/or to a student with special needs, financial or otherwise". Capital held in the Sydney Boys High School Scholarship Fund is currently sufficient to

enable the school to offer one scholarship each year. Previous PJ Day Scholarship winners were: 2009 - Alexander Belokopytov (Year 12) and 2010 - Terence Pham (Year 9). Heavily involved all-rounders, boys pursuing excellence in a single field of endeavour or someone with a special need, are encouraged to apply. Supporting documentation can be attached to the simple application form. Act now! You will never know if you don't have a go!

State of the Learning Environment



The SBHS School Council has expressed its concern at the untidiness of the school grounds. Despite the best efforts of Mr

Barris to provide more secure bins in convenient locations, boys are still not in the habits of always finding a bin for their rubbish. Visitors to our school notice these things particularly. It is time for stronger action by the school to make sure our grounds can be pleasant to rest or play in. I am looking to School Prefect Interns to take it upon themselves to model responsible playground and corridor behaviour. Do as Mr Barris and I do as we are walking around stop and pick up a food wrapper or discarded container and put it where it should have gone in the first instance - in a bin! Show others that you personally care about what the school looks like. Encourage others to adopt the same attitude. Staff members are encouraged to ask boys to clean up the playground area they have been occupying during their breaks. Things need to improve. Students may be asked to do detentions cleaning up the grounds.

Cost of Utilities



The school is paying > annually \$125,000 utilities. Energy and water charges are tipped to rise

steeply in the next few years. The school has purchased a sophisticated meter and software that records variations in water use. We can now see how much water is being used and when. Leaking cisterns, taps and appliances can waste more than 15,000 litres per day.

For some time we had a wastage rate of 30,000 litres a day. It is up to all of us to preserve water. Our society and our planet require our responsible actions. Boys pushing wads of toilet paper into cisterns cause a lot of waste. Jamming flush buttons has the same effect. I would like to spend public money on computers or coaches, not on wasted water or plumbers to repair vandalised toilets. If you see a running tap, turn it off. Please report to the Office or Mr Barris or me if you notice any appliance that could be leaking.

Letters Re Absence/Lateness/ Early Leave

Each letter should be signed by a parent or guardian with the <u>name date</u> and <u>roll class</u> of your son <u>printed clearly</u>. Your son needs to pick up a leave pass from the Main Office before he leaves the school.

If you require leave for your son please, apply in writing and address your application to the Principal, Dr Jaggar, stating the reason and length of time of the leave. Your son must then present this application to Dr Jaggar for permission for the leave.

Please remember to apply before the leave and not after.

The Principal must approve all leave applications.



FCB Escola - Talent Recruitment Program's main objective is to train and identify talented football players that may ultimately join the Futbol Base (at an elementary level) of FC Barcelona.

Once a year, the FCB Escola – Talent Recruitment Program will arrange for an FCB Escola coach to travel to Australia to spend time reviewing and recruiting from a pool of football players.

One nominated player, with a companion (parent), will then be awarded, at no cost, airfares to Barcelona, Spain, plus accommodation for 5 days (7 nights), so the player may carry out the necessary tests and training at FCB Escola, Barcelona. If the player passes the tests they may, at the player's option, train with the FCB Team according to age.

Objectives of FCB Escola – Talent Recruitment Program

- Teaching the basic concepts of football to enable players to genuinely challenge for the nominated player position, or better.
- Transmit the values that represent FC Barcelona: Tolerance, Respect, Solidarity, Commitment, and Camaraderie.

Training for both boys and girls between 5 to 15 years that enjoy the emotion of:

- . Training twice a week; and
- . Playing games at the weekend (Futbol7)

Pupils are divided into the following groups

Initiation stage

Boys and girls aged 5 to 7 years. The main focus is on the coordination and motor skills aspects of football.

Boys and girls aged 8 to 9 years. In this stage of the course there are 12 groups working on basic football skills.

Training stage

Boys and girls aged 10 and up. In this stage there Boys and girls age are 10 groups working on simple tactics and the skills development.
