## Staff Development Survey 2010

A comprehensive survey of staff development and professional learning was undertaken during term 3. The results were compiled by Ms Williams and have been published and discussed with the School Executive. Seventy staff members completed the survey of a FTE staff of 75, a 93% response rate. Some staff were on leave, so the result is a very strong one. The survey confirms that the integration of ICT into teaching and learning has gathered great momentum at High. It also affirms the efforts made by teachers to keep up to date with the latest pedagogical approaches. Some useful suggestions and more detailed data items came out of the survey. I hope to implement several of these for next year. I want to thank all staff for their great interest and cooperation in completing the survey with so much honesty and detail.

LanguagePerfect is a website which offers students the possibility to improve their vocabulary, grammar and sentence structure knowledge in the language of their choice (preferably the language they are also studying at school!). As an introduction to the site the organisers offered again the participation in the Olympics for free and the students got involved with great enthusiasm as they could see their score and that of their classmates on screen and if nothing else they are very competitive. The fact that they had to get a word right three times (randomly) ensured that they knew it by the time it came around the third time – and only then did they score a point.

It was not only the occasional lesson in the computer lab which improved the tally – they could – and did – access the site from home, too, and outdo their nearest rival. The result was quite amazing – the founders of the site – three New Zealand whizz kids – came to our school and presented the participants with five Silver (Sai Vimalanathan, Darryl Chan, Tom Du, Jesse Cooper and Allan Shi) and six Bronze Medallist Certificates (Edric Wang, Sheng An Zhang, Benjamin Nguyen, Samuel Pham, Steve Tran and William Wu) plus a large number of Credit certificates. Overall our school's ranking was 30 out of 400.

It is now planned to subscribe to LanguagePerfect for one year to build on the enthusiasm and – as we can submit our own material – encourage the boys to practise their vocabulary skills.

Alternatively, this degree also allows the study of majors in philosophy, criminology, linguistics, or history and philosophy of science from the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences in preparation for a variety of social science careers. Students with a specific interest in physiological and neuroscientific aspects of psychology can combine Psychology with the study of vision science, neuroscience, anatomy or physiology from the Faculty of Science to prepare them for a career in a healthcare or biomedical research setting.

Students may also choose to focus on Psychology alone, and at the end of their second year, students in this degree have the option to choose courses that will provide them with the pre-requisites to gain entry to the Honours (fourth) year in Psychology.

Three or four year programs in Psychology can also still be studied through the existing B Psychology, B Science (Advanced) and B Science degrees.

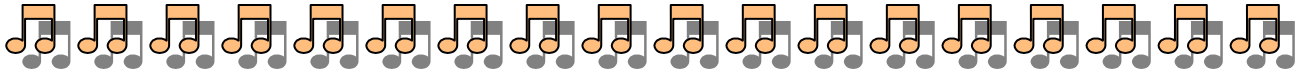

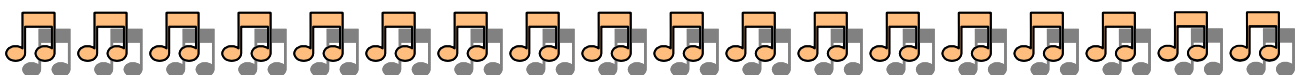
