Using the Student and Parent Portal

Parents and students can keep themselves informed about subject selection policies and processes well in advance of the scheduled parent meetings in September. Parents can log into their portal via the website. On the navigation bar they can choose 'Shared R: drive'/ subject selection. At that location are four files: 'subject selection process', Year 10 2012 Subject Info, Year 11 2012-13 Subject Info and Year 9 Curriculum Handbook 2012-13. At your leisure you can read about the subject or course offerings for the coming year and discuss them with your son. You may have questions that you can clarify during term 3, ahead of the selection process and Information evenings.

There are many terrific features on the student / parent portal. There is a fully populated 'my diary' that you can use to organise your time. You can keep up to date with 'Career News' or book an appointment with the Careers Adviser ('Careers Interviews'). You can check out 'Exam timetables' to make sure of your commitments or check the 'Daily Routine Variation' to see what's happening. If you are researching something, you can choose 'Library Search' or 'Online Databases' to access powerful and expensive data sources like JSTOR and Britannica Online. You may need 'Herald in the Classroom', EBSCOhost or TALE or ProQuest. Perhaps you might want to check out what your local library has available. All these functions are available through 'Online databases'.

Parents can log on to all these services by supplying an e-mail address to the school as well as ascertaining their son's ID number. Keep yourself fully informed about what is going on, when tests are scheduled, variations to routine and other administrative matters. Help us to personalise learning for your son!

Year 12 Interviews

Peer Mediation at SBHS

Hey got a problem? Get peer mediated! Peer mediation is a program run by a select group of Year 11 students which seeks to solve conflict between students without getting teachers involved. The program seeks to help the students resolve their issues while under the guidance of the Year 11 students. The program is confidential and stays between the peer mediators (Year 11 students) and the students who have a problem with each other.

How it works

When two students have a disagreement they are to email the following address: PeerMediation@sydneyboys-h.schools.nsw.edu.au

requesting a Peer Mediation session. From this point Ms Barr will receive the request and will appoint two Peer Mediators to accompany the disputers in a closed off room, whereby the two students will eventually resolve their problem and sign an agreement to not create more problems with each other.

NEWS FROM LATIN

On Thursday, 16th June, Year 12 Latin attended the annual Latin Seminars Day held at Shore School, North Sydney.

This day is an annual event organised by CLTA (The Classical Languages Teachers' Association) and aims to assist students sitting the Higher School Certificate in Latin through a series of lectures and powerpoint presentations focussing on important aspects of the literary texts set for study.

Students this year are studying Vergil's *Aeneid X* as their poetry text and Cicero's important indictment of Verres, the governor of Sicily tried for extortion, *In Verrem, (Against Verres)*. This court case established Cicero as the outstanding orator of his day in Rome. These are the Continuers texts.

The Extension course looks at Roman Satire as presented by Horace, *Satire 1.9*, and Juvenal, *Satire III.* There were a number of schools in attendance, including North Sydney Boys High, North Sydney Girls, Sydney Girls and St George Girls High.

Students were fortunate to have as guest speakers, experts in their field, such as Paul Roche, Classics Department, Sydney University.

Such days are important as students gain a deeper understanding of the prescribed texts from a different perspective.

CREATING A READING ENVIRONMENT



The 2 Librarians were privileged to attend a special in-service at the State Library on "Creating a reading environment at your school" several weeks ago. As this is a message dear to the heart of Librarians and Head Teachers of English at every

school interested in improving Literacy, we met lots of really interesting and committed colleagues.

The messages we can relay to parents and teachers who really like to encourage their boys to read come from Eric Richards who is especially focusing on Reading for Gifted and Talented Children:

He says with regard to book reviews - "encourage children to write from the heart (not to a formula)"

He reminds us that *magazines*, *Non-Fiction*, *reading on line and reading manuals are all reading* and to be affirmed.

He reminds us that freedom of choice involves the *choice not to keep reading.*

He reminds us to *never make a book a punishment*. Readers need the *opportunity to have regular and enthusiastic talks* about what they are reading.

Opportunities are needed for *peer recommendations*. Readers need to be really *encouraged to be brave enough to choose for themselves*.

The really interesting focus of this in-service was on personal recommendations of the most currently published children's literature. All of these recommendations focused on the books and lessons available to teachers.

A full report on this material will be sent to relevant Head Teachers and will be available on the P Drive for staff to access.

Our Year 12 have done really well this year and won the regional final of the Hume Barbour competition. Unfortunately there was a clash of commitments for our third speaker on the day of the interregional debate and, despite Christopher Chiam doing a wonderful job of taking his place; we lost to Smiths Hill after 40 minutes split decision adjudication. Our Year 11s beat Woolooware in the first round, James Cook Boys forfeited the second round and they beat Gymea Tech High school to become Zone winners. Thank you very much to Brian Webb who is the teacher responsible for Years 11 and 12 PDC and for Michael Coutts and Kelvin Yu who are their coaches.

Well done to Andrew Bui and Rakulan Arulmurugan who debated alone against the Burwood Girls team. Thank you very much to Duncan Stedman who stood in for Celia Finnie this term and has managed the Years 9 and 10 PDC debating and to Blaise Prentice-Davidson and Lucian Tan who are their coaches.

Last week our Year 7 and Year 8 teams debated against Rose Bay Secondary College. On Wednesday we were away and Year 7 were victorious against the Year 7 opponents, but Year 8, unfortunately, were beaten by the Year 8 team. When Rose Bay came to us to debate on Friday our Year 7 team did an excellent job of debating against the Year 8s and won, as did the Year 8s who debated Rose Bay's Year 7. Both home teams must debate each other next term and the winner of these first three rounds will go head to head with other winners in a knock-out competition until a regional final is reached. I would like to thank the Year 7 and Year 8 coaches but especially Justin Chan and Anthony Paul who attended all these debates to give very helpful feedback to both teams.

In the first week back we will have the Debating Assembly on Friday and that afternoon the GPS season begins with our first debate against Kings.

INTERVIEW WITH IAN HEADS PROLIFIC AUTHOR/SPORTS JOURNALIST AND OLD BOY By Brendan Hancox - Year 9

Ian Heads (class of 1960) returned by special invitation to Sydney Boys High Senior Assembly to share his stories of great sportsmen and women he has interviewed in the course of his career as a sports journalist. Ian's more prominent works include: *A Glorious Obsession: 200 Years of Australian Sport (1988), A Centenary of Rugby League, 1908-2008, Saints: The Legend Lives On* As he has talked with and written about some of Australia's greatest sporting stars I was asked to take the opportunity to interview him for *High Notes.*

After graduating from SBH in 1960, Ian was first introduced to journalism when he became a copy boy working for the *Daily Telegraph*. His wage was four pounds a week and his job description included running weather reports around, passing on messages and getting meals and drinks for the journalists. Ian described the job as 'menial'. However his position as copy boy was a stepping stone in his career and in 1962, Ian applied for a cadetship at the *Daily Telegraph*. Ian described how at the time education and training to become a journalist was conducted 'in-house' rather than in universities or TAFE.

lan was required to write in all areas of news and current affairs and what he would be reporting changed on a daily basis. Ian wrote about sport, politics, social affairs and general news in his early days. As a student of Sydney Boys High, Ian was keen about sport. A full-time position was offered to Ian after a young sports' journalist resigned. He said that he he'd 'been in sport ever since'. In a sense his future had chosen him.

lan covered the 1980 Olympics in Moscow for the *Daily Telegraph* and it marked the end of his nineteen year full-time service to the paper. One of the most memorable moments lan had during his time there was getting his first by-line, which he describes as 'something you had to really earn' in those days. He was only two years into his cadetship and chance saw him writing an article on speed-skating, a sport of which lan had no experience at all.

In 1981, Ian was offered a job as Editor of the Australian Consolidated Press (ACP) sports magazine 'Rugby League Week'. At the time, it attracted an audience of around 80-90 thousand readers per week. Ian was in the job for six years while also being a columnist for the *Sydney Morning Herald* and the *Daily Telegraph*.

In 1987, Ian left the magazine to become a freelance writer. A book had been commissioned and the publication date was to coincide with the Bicentenary celebrations. The book was to be about the history of Australian sport. To write such a book was a daunting task, especially since it was lan's first book and the research had to be done entirely using pre-existing books and newspapers (a certain nightmare for today's Internet spoilt students). Ian, of course, did all the research by himself and he recalled spending many, many long hours in libraries.

I asked lan about what he had learned from the sportspeople he had worked with and followed through his lifetime, especially about their particular gualities. Work ethic, talent, toughness and commitment were all mentioned as 'star gualities'. Des Renford, a famous Australian long distance swimmer was one example chosen by lan as having a rock-solid work ethic. Des Renford would never miss a training session. Even in horrendous weather conditions, when everyone else was inside in front of the fire, he would be out swimming across Coogee beach rain, hail or shine. His commitment to improving himself showed in his performance of making 19 crossings of the English Channel and being named; 'King of the Channel' in 1980.

Herb Elliot, was one of Australia's greatest middledistance runners and took gold in the 1500m at the 1960 Rome Olympics in a world record time. Herb became particularly good at overcoming the "little voice" which was constantly saying he was too tired to continue. At the Rome Olympics 1500 final, he was feeling exhausted, after just two laps. But he ignored the voice and powered to the finish line, with a margin of 15-20 metres.

Finally, I asked Ian what some of his current projects were. He listed two books including a biography of former professional rugby league player and now coach, Brad Fittler, which will be about a look into the game of rugby league from a different perspective. The other is a history of the Balmoral Beach Club, in which Ian also describes the Aboriginal history of the area.

Overall, Ian's insights into sport and the players were intriguing and wise. However, what I admire most about Ian's character is not just his knowledge or experience, but his humility. He keeps his focus on his next task and it is surely the reason that the Andrews Library at school has 27 books written by Ian in the Old Boys Collection.


