Thank you to Mr Hannon (organiser), the history staff (Ms Powell, Davis, Genias and Berger and Mr Devlin) and Ms May and Ms Grace from visual arts, for their running of the history excursion to Canberra. The event ran smoothly and the boys were excellently behaved.

Safety At School



At High we have always been socially and culturally diverse and we have celebrated our

diversity. The more we talk and write about the right for everyone in our school community to be treated respectfully and to feel safe, the more we will raise awareness of the issue of safety and promote strategies to achieve a great sense of security amongst our boys. All students, from whatever race, creed or culture, with whatever disability or illness and of whatever sexual orientation, have basic rights of physical psychological safety at school. We work hard to meet the needs of students with physical or mental health issues but do we acknowledge and try as hard to meet the needs of same-sex attracted, questioning or transgendered students? Last week a group comprising four senior staff members, a student and a parent representative, met to discuss this issue and to suggest what first steps High would take in response to the Proud Schools initiative.

The group agreed that three first steps might be effective. First, the *School Prefects* have agreed to be proactive in speaking to boys in the playground if they hear inappropriate language. They will tell them how their utterances may offend others and that they are unacceptable. Second, the school will conduct an audit of its PDHPE programs to ascertain whether they are meeting the needs of same sex attracted, questioning or transgendered students. Third, training for teachers was seen to be a vital first step in culture change at the school. In Term 3 on a *School Staff Development* day a session for staff to raise awareness would be programmed.

Local Schools, Local Decisions



"Next Steps" is a NSW government "roadmap for change acknowledging that people working in

our schools with their communities are best placed to make decisions about our students". lt has а website www.schools.nsw.edu.au/lsld to peruse. There are five fact sheets outlining what we know; where we are heading in the future; what has to happen to support where we are heading; what will happen next; and an indicative timeline. The factsheets are: managing resources, reducing red tape; making decisions; working locally; and staff in our schools. The policies and fact sheets can be viewed [by staff] at P:\Schoolwide and Learning\Planning\DET Teaching Planning Policy\LSLD. On the face of it the reform agenda looks powerful. We will await with interest the rollout of changes.

Trusts under SHSF Management



The Sydney High School Foundation is Trustee for funds held on the school's behalf to be used for specific

purposes. Movement in the Trust accounts for 2011 were: Ethel Killip Memorial Art Collection (\$94.4k to \$98.0k); Mitchell Seow Memorial Trust (\$6,804 to \$6,976); The Prizes Trust (\$52.9k to \$66.2k); and SBHS Scholarship Trust (\$41.6k to \$49.9k). A proportion of the interest from the investment of these funds (usually 25%) is paid to the school to help fund the purposes of the Trusts, the remainder is reinvested to grow the Trusts. The Sydney High Foundation provides an ongoing financial service to the school *at no cost* and I want to acknowledge

how beneficial the relationship is, with over \$221,200 under management.

Always ride in a safe and courteous manner

A number of schools are embracing and enjoying the City's cycling initiative. To ensure all bike riders (and, in particular, your family) ride as comfortably and safely as possible and in a courteous way:

Always be seen and be heard:

- Ensure your bike has an easy-touse, working bell
- Always wear a brightly coloured, correctly fitted helmet
- Wear a highly reflective vest
- Check lights and reflectors on bike are working and clean

Choose the best route – use bike paths where you can:

- Children up to the age of 12 are permitted to ride on any footpath, and an adult may ride on the footpath while accompanying a rider under 12
- Look out for vehicles reversing from and turning into driveways

Shared paths are a great option, for bike riders:

- Pedestrians always have right of way
- Bike riders must be prepared to stop for people walking by riding at a speed from which they can safely stop without scaring anyone
- As a bike rider approaches a pedestrian, they must slow down and should ring their bell early to warn of their approach
- Bike riders should keep to the left, but take extra care near buildings in case people are coming out

Dear High Debating Parent,

Recently you would have received an invoice for the co-payment for your son to participate in the School's Debating program this season. Please make this payment to the School office as soon as possible. The debating co-payments are scaled to represent the coach to student ratio which intensifies as the students get older.

SBHS provides an outstanding program of sport and other co-curricular activities such as music and debating. As a GPS School, High offers our boys opportunities to participate in programs that are unmatched in any other public school in Australia and even in most private schools, where the fees are many times those at SBHS. Moreover, our programs are structured to fit with the academic focus of our students.

As a result, High produces outstanding scholar-sportsmen equipped not only for academic success but with the broader skills and attributes to succeed in their careers and their lives. Debating, for example, is an activity which develops the skills of speaking publically, critical thinking and logical argument. These skills are essential for success in most (if not all) future careers your son may aspire to.

We have an extremely successful record in debating at High, but in recent years we have noticed a range of our competitor schools have been able to pour resources into their programs, resources that, as a Public School, we simply do not have. If we are to remain one of the best debating schools in NSW it is essential that we get financial support from parents.

The School makes a substantial contribution to the cost of providing its fifteen co-curricular programs but is unable to cover the full cost from the relatively low annual contributions it invoices to parents at the beginning of each year. To help provide adequate coaching and facilities, the School Council, supported by the P&C Association, has requested that the School also charge a co-payment per boy for each co-curricular activity.

For Debating, the School pays for 18 high quality coaches who have or are currently debating at Inter-University Level and the cost of the MIC – so that she can be released from timetable commitments to organise the program and for limited release time for other members of staff to escort students to debates. Other costs are membership fees for three private and one public competition, regular opportunities for boys to attend additional coaching or debating tournaments at University, social debates with other schools and additional competitions such as UNYA

Unlike most other co-curricular activities at High debating runs for three terms. In addition, unlike many competitor schools, we have a very inclusive program which means we endeavour to give as many students the opportunity to debate in competitions as we can. Even after GPS selections have been made we continue to provide high quality coaching and debating opportunities for those boys who have been unsuccessful in this selection process or didn't want to try out for this competition.

LIVE FIRE SHOOT

A detachment of senior cadets with Second Lieutenant Anthony Ho in charge, are off to Holsworthy this weekend to participate in a live fire shoot with the Army's current service rifle , the Austeyr F88.

Other school and community based cadets from the Sydney and South area will shooting alongside

In addition to shooting our cadets will join members of Hurlstone Agricultural High School Cadet Unit in several short field exercises.



The Austeyr F88 rifle is the standard rifle carried by soldiers on the Australian Army and also used by the Royal Australian Navy, ground elements of the Royal Australian Air Force as well as New Zealand forces.

Firing the 5.56mm NATO cartridge, the F88 is equipped with optical sights and a 30 round magazine.

F88 shoots are always popular with cadets; before shooting the F88, cadets are required to undergo safety and handling training with the rifle.

NEW UNIFORMS

Fifteen Phase One recruits have been issued with their cadet uniforms this week. Over the next 2 weeks the balance of our new recruits will receive their uniforms. You will notice our new uniformed members moving about the School on Tuesdays.

CADET VACANCIES

Some further vacancies are available in the cadet unit for boys aged at least 12 years and six months.

This minimum age is set by the Cadet Force Regulations of the Defence Act and not something the Unit or School can change.







