Cyber Safety Presentation

Cyber expert Robyn Rishani presented to Years 8 and 10 and to parents from SBHS and SGHS on Thursday last. The evening was organised by the Cyber Management Committee led by Rachel Powell. Ms Rishani's presentation ranged across a spectrum of concerns about use of the internet. She discussed safety and security when accessing social networking sites, how to control teenage internet use and what to do about excessive gaming. She employed the extended metaphor of the cyber world as a playground with attractions and dangers. Like a playground, rules for use and limitations for actions on the equipment are Teenagers need necessary. particularly in respect to time and site access, and they need to be enforced. Saturday Sport Attendance Monitoring

It is always important for MICs and coaches to know whether everybody will be attending Saturday sport. Teams and our opponents need to know, too. David Isaacs has designed a procedure to allow student self-reporting in advance for absences from Saturday sport. The process will be trialled

on the final winter sport fixture against Sydney Grammar on Saturday. Students can access the system from the Student Portal by going to My Absences -> "I'm going to be absent from sport" – https://student.sbhs.net.au/absences/sport.

The student then picks their sport and clicks a button. The acceptability of the reason for absence will be determined once a note explaining the absence from sport is submitted on Monday. In addition, coaches will be taking attendance checks and recording them electronically for Monday morning data collection. Once summer sport commences, attendance at Saturday sport will be checked each week. Our plan is to extend attendance checking to all training sessions as soon as practicable.

Acceleration Information evening



Our annual information evening for Year 9 parents on High's acceleration program

was held this week. A soft copy of the presentation is available through the Parents' Portal. Year 9 boys who are interested in subject acceleration should discuss it with their teacher in the first instance. Generally, acceleration is available in modern history, geography, music 2 and business studies. Occasionally, in special cases, boys are permitted to accelerate in visual arts, PDHPE, design and technology and some languages. Generally speaking, attempts at acceleration in English, chemistry, physics, biology, software design and engineering studies are not allowed. Mathematics has its own program of accelerative enrichment in Years 9 and 10 followed by a formal acceleration of 80 of the best 2-unit students in Year 11. Each Faculty has its own policy adapted from the school's policy. Students are reminded that applications for admittance to acceleration courses for 2013 are due in by the end of term. I look forward to seeing everyone at the Debating Dinner on Saturday. Rachel Powell Debating Coordinator



Last Saturday the 13Cs played The Scots College 13Hs. It was their best performance this season, and pleasingly witnessed by a large number of High parents.

In the first half we fielded fourteen of our 12 year old players, who should be the nucleus of the 13As in 2013. They were very competitive against an older and more experienced team. Lucas Wong showed his talent and versatility playing a great game at five eighth. Louis Saunders, Connor Fisher and Cameron Ma played strongly in the forwards. The honours were shared at half time 10 all.

In the second half the regular team took the field and Stephen Nguyen took control. The improvement in every player was evident for all to see. A testament to their improvement was the fact that all the wingers were given time and space for solo runs in open play during the game, eight in total, and that the team scored tries from set plays, team work and individual determination. Raymond Huang benefited from a well-worked scrum based play with Daniel Wang. Connor Fisher scored in the corner after several recycles at the breakdown and Tushaya Mehdiratta scored a 70m solo try because he refused to be tackled.

The biggest improvement can be seen in the line-out. Hamza Mulla soars above the opposition taking two handed grabs, supported by the strength of Daniel Wang, Matthew Whitaker and Cameron Ma and the accurate throwing of Louis Saunders.

The challenge for the team is to put a solid performance in against Grammar in the last game of the season.
