White Ribbon and Proud Schools



Staff from High attended conferences last week addressing key societal issues impacting on learning – domestic violence and homophobic bullying or discrimination based on binary notions of gender performance. At the heart of both of these social problems is the notion of 'respectful relationships'. As individuals, we all have the right to live our lives free from fear – the fear of ridicule, ostracism or physical violence. We all need to respect the right of others to be different – to hold different views, to hold different beliefs and to have different sexual orientations. We must all learn to respect each other as persons with fundamental human rights. It is ironic that we focus on helping others outside the school with recognisable and public problems but we are mostly loathe to confront social problems within the school, possibly out of embarrassment, or fear of offending or intruding on the lives of others.

At High we know we have a percentage of our boys who are not reaching their potential. It is impossible for boys at High to reach their academic and personal bests if they are constantly on guard or in a state of fear

about what may be said or done to them in various contexts, at home or at school. In our school context a good question to ask is: "Where's the harm?" If another person looks or acts differently to me or has differing views, how does that impact on me? I am still free to be me. If there is no harm, leave other people alone! We must learn to co-exist in peace.

For the small minority of our students coming to school and trying to learn is very difficult because they are burdened with problems in relationships at home or at school or both. Their reactions might be withdrawal into the cyber world, depression, self-harm or acting out in anger. Excessive internet use or gaming by boys result in underachievement at school. Depression leads to underachievement, acting out leads to exclusion from classes or school. Urge those you know who are showing signs of depression, self-harm or gaming addiction to seek professional help.

When the impacts on persons of the words or actions of others are so damaging as to incapacitate them, as a learning community we must do something to help. White Ribbon is an organisation aimed at changing men's behaviour to renounce violence against women. Such violence includes verbal abuse and physical intimidation. Students have to model respectful relationships with girls and women in their environment, including SGHS. Proud schools is a pilot project aimed at promoting tolerance in schools for same sex attracted and gender questioning students. Various activities are being planned to raise awareness and influence perceptions about the importance of these issues in a just society.

Joint Project Update

Now that we have received final concept drawings and a risk assessment matrix from DEC Planning, we are about to launch into the next phase of the project.

SBHS and SGHS need to negotiate agreements to define relationships –between the schools and DEC, between the schools together and contractors or employees,

between SBHS and SGHS in operational matters once the building is constructed, and between the schools together and third parties who may wish to use the facility. The next steps are to commit funds together, to hire a Project Manager and commence detailed investigations of the site and to prepare a DA for Council.

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High Resolves Initiative (Global Leadership Program)

Doodling for Disability

The Year 10 High Resolves leaders' group completed their Community Action Project at the end of Term 3. The 36 boys decided earlier in the year that they wanted the theme of their project to be disability rights. They worked through a social action leadership framework to come up with a project objective. Their aim was to get 2000 people to show their support for a fully funded National Disability Insurance Scheme. The boys wanted a unique selling point and so rather than simply getting people to sign a petition they were going to encourage people to doodle for disability.

Throughout terms 1, 2 and 3 the boys attended 8 two-hour working sessions, where they brainstormed ideas, selected the ones that would work the best, broke down into teams, sought permission and organised logistics. At each stage in the process the boys were asked to reflect not only on their project but also what they were learning about leadership. As well as a High Resolves Program Manager the boys were also guided by a number of business mentors from Deloitte.

In August, with all the planning complete, the boys took to the streets to spread their message and get people to start doodling. The boys split themselves into groups and targeted Martin Place, Hyde Park and Parramatta station in the morning. In the afternoon, different boys went to Circular Quay and Town Hall. In the meantime, the boys had also launched an online petition.

Back at school, the boys collated all the results and prepared a presentation for members of the school executive and representatives from High Resolves. The boys managed to get 900 doodles, 200 likes on their Facebook page along with 600 individual hits. Even though the boys did not achieve their objective, there were many successes, for example, their team work and their passion for the cause. The group also reflected on the challenges they faced and what they would do differently in the future. The main findings were that they needed to get better at managing their time and the importance of communicating across the streams. Overall, the boys thought that the lessons that they learnt would be very useful for the different leadership roles they will face in the future.

National History Challenge winner

Congratulations to Thomas Nguyen, who won the Year 8 division of the National History Challenge for 2012! For his entry, Thomas wrote an outstanding essay on the role Tsar Nicholas II played in the creation of a communist state in Russia. He argued that Nicholas's failure to rule effectively had significant consequences for 20th Century world history, leading to events such as the Cold War and the Cuban Missile Crisis. Several other students made it to National judging, and will receive their certificates shortly.

The Challenge is run annually by the state History Teachers Associations of Australia, and is open to all high school students. Each year has a particular theme – this year it was People and Consequences. Although previously the competition has been limited to Australian history, this year the field was broadened to include any aspect of the past, in line with the new National Curriculum for history – there was even a special category celebrating the Diamond Jubilee of the Queen!



MARCHING BAND


The Marching Band will resume as of WEEK 6, on TUESDAY and FRIDAY AFTERNOONS, after school.
