## From the Principal

### High Talent

Newcomer to High, Christian Haddo (Year 9), set 4 school records at the swimming carnival: 15 years 50m 'fly (29.8); 50m free (26.8); 100 m free (58.3) and 200m free (2.15.2). Allen Guo (7F) set records in 12 years 50m breaststroke (43.15) and 50m 'fly (37.6). Kalem Best (Year 9), another new boy, swam 2.17.8 for 14 years 200m free. Darren Chien (Year 12) set a new record in the 17+ 100m backstroke (1.17.88). Kevin Guo (Year 8) swam 35.19 for 14 years breaststroke and Leonard Mah posted 1.01.50 for the 16 years freestyle. Brandon Yoon broke the 13 years 200m freestyle record with a time of 2.28.0. All boys were also Age champions except for 16 years – Michael Sawang. Congratulations to all boys on their fine efforts at the carnival.

### Sick/Injured arrangements for Wednesday / Thursday afternoons

Students need to go to Room 105 at 12.50pm if they have a note from a parent or doctor indicating why they are unable to take part in sport for the afternoon. If students do not have a note or doctors certificate, they will be sent to Sports Development for the afternoon. Their attendance at Sports Development will be recorded. If a student brings repeated notes from a parent only, the student will be asked to seek medical advice, bring a doctor's certificate diagnosing what the problem might be, and the length of recovery required. If a student becomes sick or is injured **during the day** on Wednesday or Thursday, then a parent will be contacted to make arrangements for the student to be collected or to go home by public transport.

### Languages study arrangements Year 7

In order to respond to student free choice electives for LOTE, Mr Dowdell organised 12 language classes, operating among the three pairs of classes. He attempted to maximise alignment with student choices but was constrained by the subjects and class numbers predetermined by school policy. Students and parents should know that the objective in Year 7 is to expose students to new languages. From Year 8 onwards, students specialise in languages they would like to study more deeply. Around 7% of boys were disappointed that their preferred selections were not available to them in Year 7. There are 3 Latin classes, 2 Chinese classes, 4 French classes and 3 German classes. ## Taree Summer Camp Report



After the success of last year's trip to Taree, the Sydney Boys High Senior Rowers travelled up north in January in expectation of a tough 5 days of rowing. The Croker family were once again hospitable enough to let us use their facilities; camping outside their house, giving us electricity, shelter and amenities, and even giving us a tour of the oar factory. On arrival, the boys set up their tents, rigged up the boats and prepared for our first row in the sweltering heat of the nation's highest recorded temperature.

Throughout the week we raced and trained in combined crews, mixing the 1<sup>st</sup> VIII, 2<sup>nd</sup> VIII and 1<sup>st</sup> IV in every conceivable class of boat to challenge our skills and strengthen our teamwork and promote unity in the sheds.

A real focus for our workloads was internal competition and race experience, with heavy workloads at dawn pitting members of the 1<sup>st</sup> VIII in long racing pieces against each other in fours and singles. These long, intense races designed by 1<sup>st</sup> VIII coach George Barris, sought to perfect our technique under pressure and fatigue, powering through physical and mental boundaries on the water. The 2<sup>nd</sup> VIII trained and worked mainly in single sculls under the watchful eye of our newly appointed Head Coach Beryl Crockford, who flogged them with time trials and 25km rows, improving their sculling technique and fitness immensely.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> IV, comprised of new rowers, trained diligently in solitude on our early days in camp, before joining in our races and demonstrating levels of technique and boat speed well beyond expectations. Old boys Pravin Radhakrishnan and Gareth Deacon trained them in pairs and singles to improve their blade work and understanding of the rowing stroke.

Overall the camp was a great success. The hard work and long, exhausting hours improved all rowers individually and brought them together as crews. Despite the heat, the weather stayed calm and offered flat water for our training. Special thanks must be made to the entire Croker family for letting us camp, the wonderful parents who gave up their time to travel up with us and cook our food as well as the coaches and the MIC of rowing, Julie Blomberg.

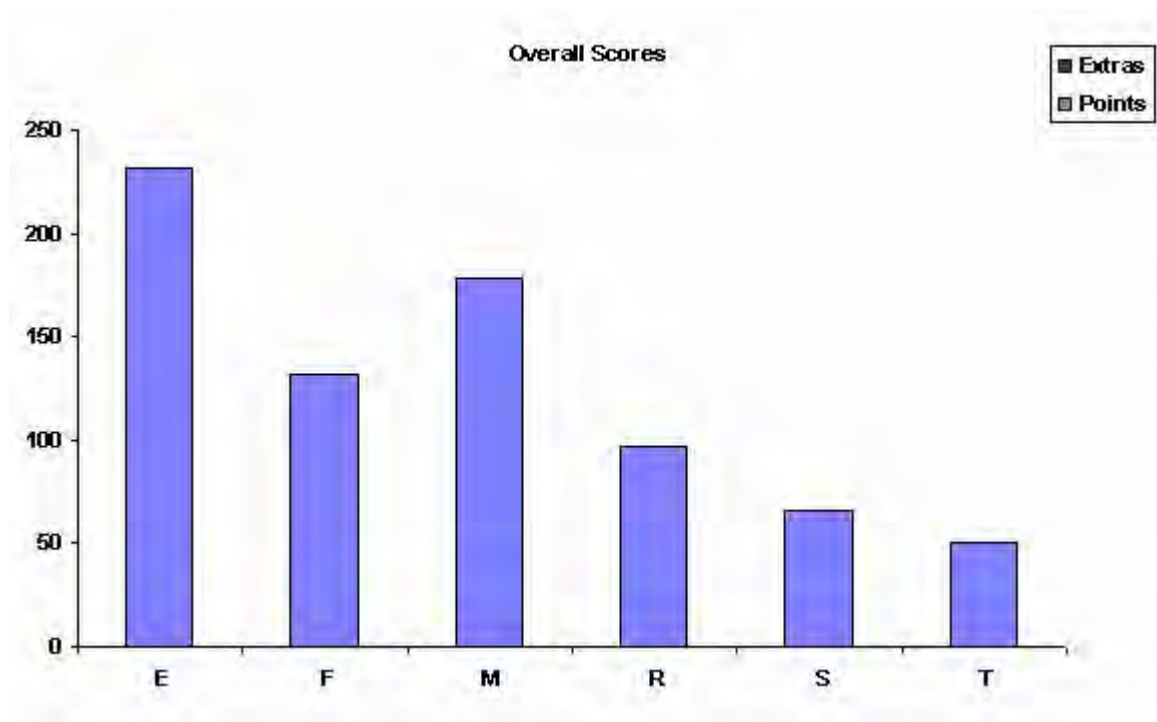

## From the Canteen

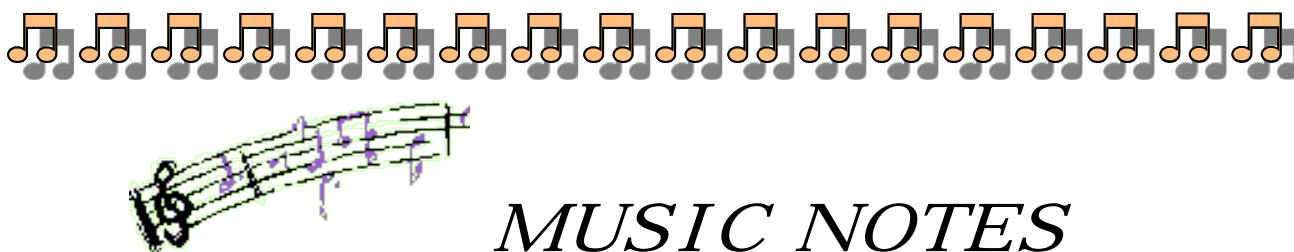

## ENSEMBLE REHEARSALS

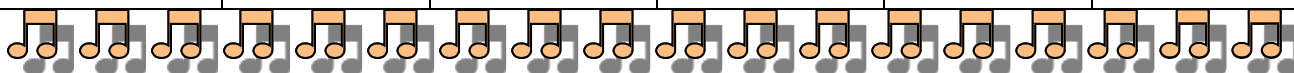
All ensembles have commenced as of this week. Morning rehearsals start at 7:45am unless stated by the music teacher/tutor conducting the ensemble.
