School Sports Policy

After a great deal of discussion by Executive, the SBHS Sports Policy was ratified on 7.5.2013. This is the product of more than 12 months of discussions and consultation with stakeholders. The policy requires formal ratification by the School Council at its next meeting. The new policy has been posted on the school's website at www.sydneyboyshigh/sport/sports-policy. I commend the work of the Sports Council, in particular Julie Connolly and Geoff Andrews who have given enormous amounts of their free time to help us develop a policy for competitive sport at High.

School Attendance Policy (2005) – Leave of Absence

It is our expectation that students will attend each day during term. If students are required by 'domestic necessity' to accompany their parents/caregivers on a trip of some kind, application must be made to the Principal. For students of compulsory age (ie <15) leave may be granted by Principals up to 15 days in total per year -2.2.6. Applications for leave for noncompulsory age students may be granted at the discretion of the Principal. Principals may decline to accept as satisfactory an an absence application for -2.2.7. Applications for leave of absence in excess of 15 days should be treated as applications for 'exemption from school attendance' -2.2.6. Parents wishing to apply for a leave of absence for their son, please go to the Parents Portal and download the application form for leave of absence. Complete it and send it to the Principal.]

In the case of students of compulsory age, applications for student leave in excess of 15 days I a 12 month period may be granted by the Minister for Education (S25, 1990). This power has been delegated to Regional Directors. A special form must be completed and forwarded through the Principal to the Regional Director for approval.

Joint Project

We have taken a large step towards realising the vision of a high quality performance, lecture and performance space for SBHS-SGHS with the Minister's approval to build the Governors Centre with school funds. This means that we can form a Project Control Group, appoint a Project Manager and commence the myriad of investigations, designs, reports and certifications needed to lodge a Development Application. This should be achievable within one year. However, we cannot enter into contracts to design and/ or construct until we have lodged the total necessary funds with DEC. The catch is that both school communities will have to have their money ready. We are falling behind SGHS in fundraising. In all likelihood they will reach their target by December, 2014. We will be at least another year reaching our target unless significant donors are brought on board from among

our Old Boys during 2013-14. It would be a pity (not to mention embarrassing) if the project had to be put on hold until SBHS produced its share. Our school community needs to get fired up to make things happen!

AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CURRICULUM – Both libraries are always very happy to work with Departments in the school to deliver their aims and objectives. New resources which relate to the National Curriculum will be found by entering the search term - Australian Curriculum – Science (English, History etc) into Library Enquiry.

CURRENT LIBRARY PROJECTS


- Term 1& 2 are totally busy *fiction resourcing* terms for Library staff.
