Thank you to the High Community

I want to thank everyone in the High community for their patience and forbearance during our extended period of carpeting and painting. Despite many requests we were unable to schedule this work to take place mostly in holiday breaks. Staff and students were impacted particularly by restricted movement in corridors and by the paint fumes. The main building does look

much brighter so I hope the gain lasts much longer than the pain. Thanks again.

Early Buses from Central

At the last School council meeting, SRC representatives Shawn Noronha and Ned Anson (Year 11) raised the matter of the removal of the 7:30 buses from Central that were dedicated to SBHS-SGHS students. The situation is that M50 buses coming from Drummoyne are emptied out at Central, thus allowing our students to use them. Departure times for these buses (with arrival at school in parentheses) are: 7:03 (7:13), 7:12 (7:22), 7:21 (7:31), 7:30 (7:41), 7:39 (7:50) and 7:50 (8:01). In fact, this M50 service reserved for school students actually improves the service to our two schools and offers more flexible alternatives than a couple of special buses. Given that is the case, State Transit has decreed that our students are **not** to use the regular bus services in the mornings during that M50 available time period.

Light Rail

Nea Saunders, Ian Sweeting and I met with officers from Transport NSW to be briefed about the light rail project proposals to date. Ross Hornsey, Senior Manager Community Engagement Project Communications transport Projects, with David Dalton, Principal Manager Engineering Services Transport Projects, walked through a PowerPoint presentation and gave us useful feedback on our concerns. The preferred engineering option is a 'cut and cover' tunnel across Moore Park West opposite Devonshire St. exiting near the Swan training field in Moore Park East and running along the eastern side of the bus lane. We have been assured that there will be no loss of amenity in Moore Park as a result of the light rail project except for considerable issues during construction. The positioning of the light rail stop has not been finalised but could be north of the existing bus stop, perhaps near the bus loop fields. It is possible that the station might be below ground level. Crowd control structures will be in place to meet the demand for major SCG events and should be able to accommodate

the 2,000 students per day that potentially might wish to use the service at the same time each school day. Getting 2k students across Anzac Parade to access the light rail remains a challenge for us to think about. We shall be putting a submission to transport NSW highlighting our major areas of concern. Overall, the light rail can only be a real asset for our school by providing a great connection to Central.

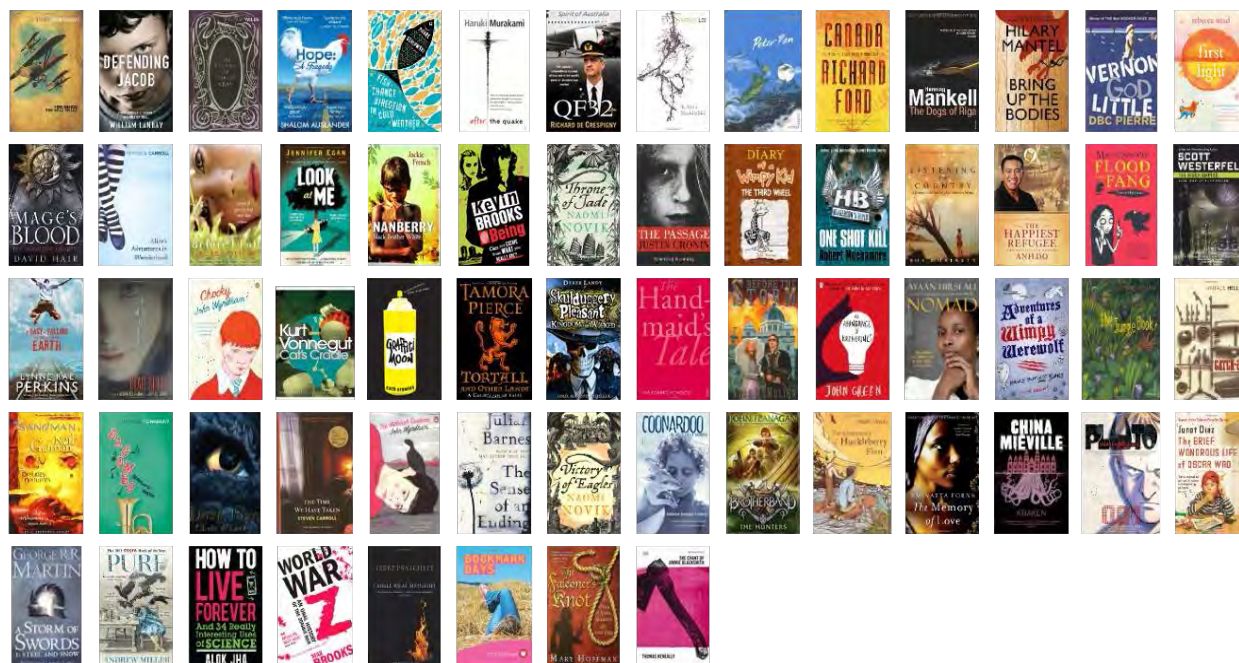

Opportunity to share your views on the Proud Schools Pilot

Dear Parent,

As you may be aware, Sydney Boys High School is one of 12 schools participating in the NSW Proud Schools Pilot. The Proud Schools Pilot is an initiative of the NSW Department of Education and Communities, which aims to support schools in providing a safe environment for all students, including those who are same sex attracted and gender diverse.

The pilot was initiated following a decade of research by La Trobe University, which indicated that same sex attracted and gender questioning young people experience better education, health and wellbeing outcomes when they feel safe and supported at school*. The pilot is supported by current Education Minister Adrian Piccoli.

We would like to provide all parents with the opportunity to comment on this pilot, and on our schools approach to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for same sex attracted and gender diverse students. Debating

We have come to the end of Term 2 now which means we are 2/3 of the way through the debating season. A big congratulations to the Year 12 PDC team who are now at Semi Final stage in the Year 12 PDC competition.

I wanted to take this opportunity to ensure that everyone is clear about Award Points.

I will allocate award points at the start of Term 4. The maximum number of award points for debating in all Years is 30 points.

The award points for coaching are based upon a regular attendance at debating through the whole 3 term season. There are 20 allocated for Year 11 and Year 12 and 15 allocated for Years 7-10.

In addition Award Points are given for debating (1 per after-school competition debate) and for chairing (1 per after-school competition debate).

PDC team members get 5 points however far they get in the competition.

In addition I sometimes offer award points for other areas such as those boys who came to watch the Year 12 Eastside Final got award points (and I can be flexible with these and give them to you from High Spirit which actually means you can go above your maximum of 30!)

It is important for you to keep a personal record of the amount of debates etc that you take part in. I, of course, have a record but sometimes there are last minutes changes to the team make up or someone can't make it to Chair and these changes may not be recorded because it is so busy.

At the start of Term 4 I will put the Award Points up on the notice board and ask students to check their allocation. Any problems MUST be reported to me then before I submit them onto the system.

I am still concerned about the lack of student and parental email contacts I have. If you want to be an active part of the Debating program you should sign up for the email by sending me an email to sbhsdebating@gmail.com with your name or your son's name and Year group.

An important date for your diary is Saturday 7th September 2013. This is our Debating Dinner which is a wonderful night to mark an end to the season.

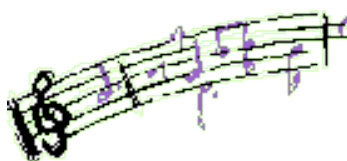
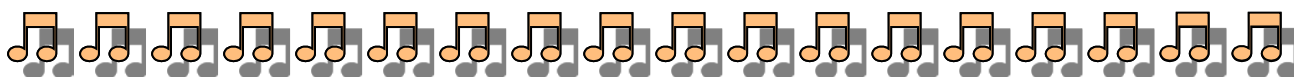

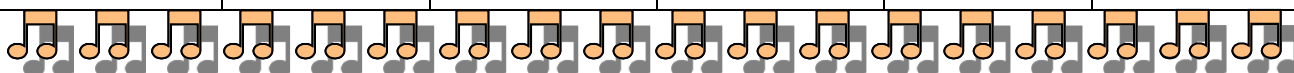

Mumps cases on the rise

NSW Health is today reminding young adults to check their immunisation status, particularly before they travel overseas amid a rise in the number of cases of mumps being reported in NSW.

Director of Communicable Diseases for NSW Health, Dr Vicky Sheppeard said there were 15 reported cases of mumps during May, most were young adults, and clustered in several regions of NSW. As not everyone who has mumps will see a doctor and have a test, it is likely that there are many more cases of mumps in the community not notified to NSW Health.

Dr Sheppeard said initial symptoms of mumps include:

- Fever
- Loss of appetite
- Tiredness and headache followed by
- Swelling and tenderness of the salivary glands, especially near the angle of the jaw.

"To prevent the spread of mumps, children and adults should have two doses of the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine also provides good protection against measles and rubella," Dr Sheppeard said.

Mumps was once a common childhood disease, but most children are now protected due to high vaccination rates. However, a significant number of young adults may have missed receiving two doses of MMR vaccine in childhood, as two doses were not routinely offered until the 1990s.

"Many people in their 20s, 30s and early 40s will not be immune, so it is particularly important they check their status with their doctor and get vaccinated if they are not sure," Dr Sheppeard said.

"Mumps can be quite a serious infection for adults. Complications can include swelling of the testicles in males, and rarely inflammation of the brain, the lining of the brain and spinal cord, pancreatitis and hearing loss. Mumps infection during pregnancy can result in miscarriage."

"Although very rare, mumps can also cause sterility in males."

Mumps takes two to three weeks to develop after exposure to an infected person, and people are infectious a week before and up to nine days after swelling of the glands.

Mumps is spread when a person breathes in the virus that has been coughed or sneezed by an infectious person, or by direct contact with their saliva.

"This is a timely reminder to parents that immunisation is the best protection against mumps. Children should be vaccinated on time with MMR vaccine at 12 months and again before they turn four years of age," Dr Sheppeard.
