## Letters Re Absence/Lateness/ Early Leave



When your son returns to school from being absent he is required to provide a letter of explanation signed by a parent or guardian. If your son is going to be late for school a note is also required. Alternatively you may contact the school by phone on 9662 9300 and dial "1" for the absentee line.

If your son has an early leave note he is required to have his note signed by either Mr Barris, Mr Dowdell or Mr Prorellis **before 8:55am** and handed in to the Main Office immediately after. Each letter should be signed by a parent or guardian with the name, date and roll class of your son printed clearly. Your son needs to pick up a leave pass from the Main Office before he leaves the school.

If your son has early leave due to a medical appointment you are required to produce a note from the provider the following day.

## NEWS FROM LATIN NATIONAL LATIN EXAM



Each year, students from Years 9 to 12 participate in the National Latin Exam, an international competition organised by The University of Mary Washington in Virginia, U.S.A. Over 100 countries participate and awards are sent from the University to all students. Students are assessed on their knowledge of Latin grammar and syntax and culture at the appropriate Year level.
