From the Principal

High Talent

Congratulations to Daniel Fang of Year 12 who has been announced as the National Winner of the UNSW Australian and NZ Economics Competition! Thomas Shortrdige and Max Koslowski came second out of 200 teams in the Dr Evatt UN Competition and will now represent NSW at the National Finals in December - a great effort! At the National Model United Nations Competition, Thomas Shortridge, Andrew McNaughton and Thomas Nguyen came third against some older opponents. Good job, boys! GPS Combined representatives to go to the CIS carnival are: James Cai, Eugene Lee, Leonard Mah, Conor McGrath, Brandon Nguyen, Pete Upatising and Lucas Wong – very well done indeed! Daniel Arzani, who left High this year to study at the AIS, has been selected in the Australian U17s team to play a FIFA World Cup Qualifier in Thailand. Well done to the first XV who came back in the second half to record a worthy win against quality opposition at Shore last Saturday. Of equal note was the first XI's come-from-behind away draw against St Ignatius. An impressive effort by all!

Prefect Interns Elected

Thirty-six boys were elected by staff and students in this week's Prefect Intern election. I congratulate all the successful candidates. I want to thank all the boys who qualified to have their names included on the ballot. I know that there were many deserving boys who have leadership qualities but shown unsuccessful. I commiserate with them, but disappointment is a part of the democratic process. I trust that these boys will show the resilience for which High boys are admired and redirect their energies into other leadership endeavours in the next twelve months.

Early Migration to Oliver Library System

High will be one of the first schools outside of the 229 LMBR pilot schools to migrate from OASIS Library to the new Library System – *Oliver*. The new system is web based and offers significant improvements for library processes. *Oliver* also creates opportunities for enhancing student learning. For example, it provides the integration ability for the school to purchase and

use e-books and other digital materials. Given the growing age and unreliability of the existing system and the fact that it is completely separate and independent from SALM and LMBR, I have accepted the offer for early migration. The 12-week implementation period for the first group of schools will commence in the last week of October this year. The migration will take place in early March 2015.

School-wide Printing Solution

Several of our photocopiers and one of our print room machines are out of warranty. We are consequently at a crossroads and need to make a decision to purchase replacement equipment seek another solution. After in-depth research by our IT team, David and James have recommended that the school should lease all its printers and photocopiers to avail ourselves of a system discount. We will receive cash back for any machines still under warranty. A negative will be that the Océ printer, which has three years left to run on its warranty, will be written off and removed. However, it hasn't been a great machine and the company supplying it has been bought out. A positive is that the school will have a manageable annual lease payment, smoothing out budgetary concerns over the next few years. Costs per copy will rise, but printing costs to students will fall in the case of colour copying at least. The deal seemed to be better all round, so I have signed up.

Joint Project - The Governors Centre

The Tender Evaluation Team has completed assessing tenders for Head Designer and has made a recommendation which was endorsed last Thursday by the PCG. The TET worked very well together over several weeks to reach unanimous agreement on the preferred tenderer. The recommended tenderer has to be approved by DEC prior to a formal contract letter being prepared. The pace of progress will accelerate over the next few months as each school commits >\$300k to getting a design worked up for PCG approval. At this exciting time I would like to take the opportunity to thank all donors to the project, past and present and hope that they will continue to support the SHS Building Fund to move the project to construction commencement stage in Q3, 2015.

MIC of Football Report

Last Saturday we came up against the highly competitive St Ignatius' College, Riverview. They have won 10 of the last 15 premierships so we knew coming into this that it was going to be no easy feat. The results may not look positive, but there is always something we can take out of this and that is the results of our 1st-4th XI. This proves with a lot of hard work, good attitude and wanting to play to our best ability for the school week in and week out the results will come our way. Our 4th XI once again put in a strong performance that

continually set the standard for our top three teams. Along with the 3rd XI both sides had opportunities to score, but ended up with what was a fair result 0-0. The 2nd XI are the result of having seven players missing from our 1st/2nd XI squad. This can unsettle the team whereby they have to continually change their structure. This is why we are even more proud of our 1st XI to come away with a 2-2 draw. Last year we were beaten 1-9 and coming into this game the Riverview boys were already looking at a win before kick-off. Our boys played extremely well being the enforcers and

deservedly taking a 1-0 lead into the half time break thanks to a great header over the keepers head into the corner by Adil Nadir. In the second half Riverview knew they had to score quickly to get themselves back into the game. They stepped up the tempo and challenged our boys. Unfortunately we conceded two goals in five minutes with Riverview now believing they will race away with the win.
