Athletics Importance

At High we believe in athletics because ability there is fundamental to capacity in other sports. For many years we have run speed and



agility sessions on Monday afternoons and more recently a Friday morning Runners Club. We provide these services at no cost because we want to encourage improved health and fitness in our students. Our official GPS athletics season is short (4-5 weeks) and free. Once again, our policy is to provide venues, coaching, training and supervision free of charge, to encourage participation. Our seasonal investment for these services exceeds \$50k.

It is an honour to represent your school at any sport but particularly athletics, because anyone can run and jump. Hence, the competition in this sport is truly state wide. High competes in both the CHS carnivals midweek and the GPS carnivals on Saturdays. The best thing is that our representatives get

to compete as teams, not just as individuals. At CHS boys compete for points as a team for the Kippax Cup and at GPS for the Junior, Intermediate and Senior trophies. I expect all boys who are successful at our school athletics carnival to offer themselves for selection in CHS and GPS representative teams. I call upon all students to develop the athletic gifts they inherited and turn them into talented performances.

I am encouraged to see the great turnout of boys for athletics this year. There were scores of boys at Monday sprints this week. Keep up the great work

Secretary For A Day



Arriving on Sunday evening at the Park Royal in Parramatta, I was greeted by a group of 33 other metropolitan and rural students from around NSW. Some students travelled as close as 20 minutes, while the furthest students travelled nearly 5 hours by train to

participate in the Department of Education (DoE) Secretary for a Day executive shadowing program. At the DoE's newest office, I shadowed the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Gerard Giesekam of the Schools Finance portfolio area. Listening in three of the CFO's meetings throughout the morning, I met various senior officers involved in the management of the government's \$1.6 billion budget assigned for primary and secondary education.

The bustling meetings were followed by a boardroom-style discussion with Mark Scott, the Secretary of DoE. Mr Scott introduced numerous topic areas which were contended among students in a highly organised manner. These areas included the controversial issue on whether aspects of HSC should be altered due to the notion that it has not changed in its style since its conception in 1967. Other topic areas involved a highly passionate debate over whether Mathematics should be made compulsory in the HSC and whether the number of subjects should be reduced to allow students to study deeper into specific subjects.

The next day was spent entirely on a forum to discuss the DoE's strategic goal: *Every student is known, valued and cared for in our schools*. Examining the data produced from Tell Them From Me surveys from NSW students, we conceived a crucial need to ensure that each student feels involved in any aspect in their community, particularly students in senior grades and female students. After learning different steps and methods to promote this strategic goal, we split into groups of five students placed randomly to examine ways to fulfil the goal. By the end of the forum, six unique ideas had been developed to be presented to a panel of three school principals and three senior DoE officers. This was truly an exceptional experience which turned out much more exciting than what I had initially expected.






