Library Use by Our Junior Students

On average, each time the Junior Library is open at break times (c400 times a year) – recess or lunch – 75 students use the facility. Library staff keep statistics on what students do in the library. About one third of the library visits are for the purposes of using BYOD to complete assigned tasks, or perform research or do online reading. They model diligence and conscientious behaviour. Focussed activities – reading, writing, playing chess – account for more than one sixth of the activities. Around the same percentage of students use their mobile phones. They use them to google, send emails or engage in social media. Staff screen out boys just playing games. If they persist, they are asked to leave the library. The Junior Library has had new blinds installed and has been

repainted. The book and article collection is being refreshed constantly to align with student needs and interests. Both of our libraries are maintained well due in no small measure to the great financial support our families continue to provide the school through their contributions to the tax deductible Library Fund.

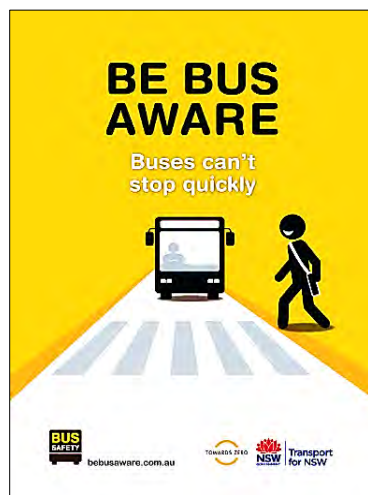
Illuminate Festival

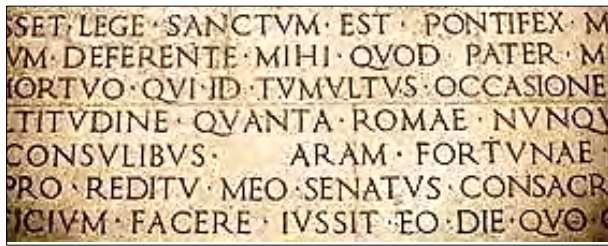
On Sunday 25 August we entered a team in the play-offs for the Australian Chess Championships which will be held in Canberra from 30 November until 1 December this year.

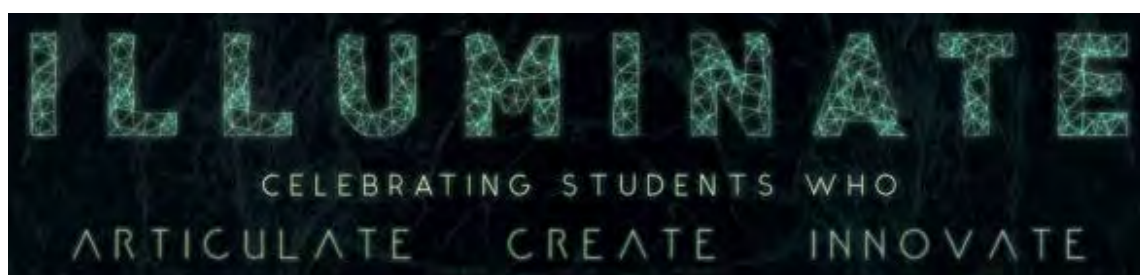

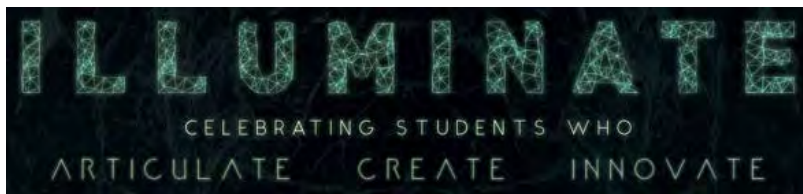
