Our CHS athletes performed strongly at the state meet. Our U12 4 x100m relay team won a



silver medal with a time of 53.82. Kane Shields won gold in the U15 800m in a smart time of 2.01.00. He won the double with gold in the 800m. Joshua Suto won gold in the U15 400m and placed third in the long jump. Raghav Ramanathan won the open high jump.

## Reading, Writing and ATAR

Famous author Stephen King believed "if you don't have time to read you don't have the time (or the tools) to write". Research suggests that reading content and frequency may exert more significant impacts on students' writing than writing instruction and frequency. A 2016 survey was completed by 45 MBA students. Their regular reading content and writing samples were analysed for syntactical complexity. Strong correlations were found between the students' most common reading content and

their writing. Reynolds, in 'Fire Up Your Reading Brain,' cites deep reading – thoughtful, slow and immersive reading rich in complexity and sensory detail – as a great aid to better writing. Other variables, such as intelligence and working memory capacity, affect the quality of writing, too.

At High, our HSC results have shown consistently, that a lack of sophistication in our writing is costing us valuable marks and hence band %s and 6s and ATAR ranks. Developing writing takes time. A recent semester one survey of Junior High students (Years 7-9) by our Teacher Librarian, gives us 'food for thought'. Unsatisfactory (0 or 1 book borrowed, including e-books): Year 7- 38%, Year 8 – 61%; Year 9 - 73%; good / very good (2-10 books borrowed): Year 7 – 55%, Year 8 – 32%, Year 9 – 22%; excellent (11+ books): Year 7- 6.8%, Year 8 – 6.5% and Year 9 – 3.9%. If we want to improve our results overall and earn more Band 6 results in courses requiring sustained writing, we need to move more students from unsatisfactory to good / very good. We also need to move more students from very good to excellent. It is everybody's task to improve reading!

## Weights Room – Summer Sports



My belief is that core strength and conditioning is essential for all sports all the time. In sports where a weights

session has been made compulsory for students for selection purposes, I am opening a window for these students to join the weights room. Membership will be open until the last day of the athletics season at a special rate of \$75. These special memberships will expire at the end of the long vacation at the end of term 4. I expect all students to then take out full year memberships in 2020. The process is to pay at the front office and take the receipt to Mr Rich to be included in the Weights Room membership roster. This will entitle you to unlimited access to the Weights Room when it is open.

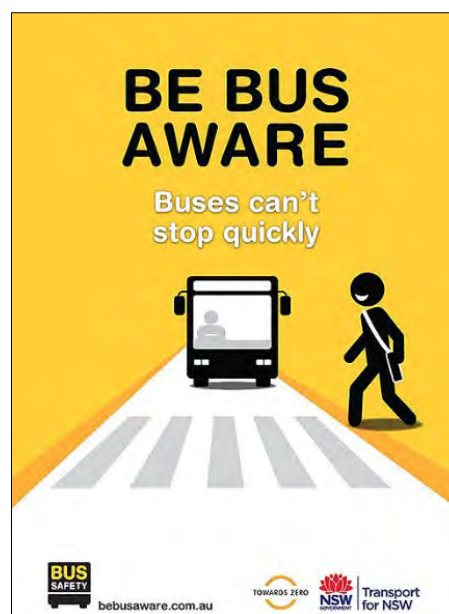

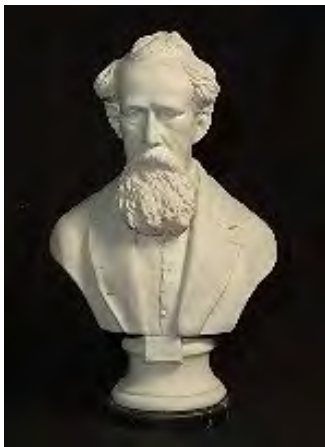
## FROM THE JUNIOR LIBRARY PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

So, to make amends, I purchased an 80 book classics collection which is now being processed by our staff.

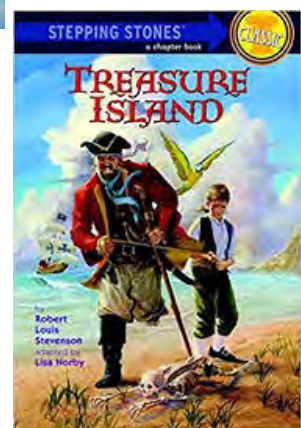
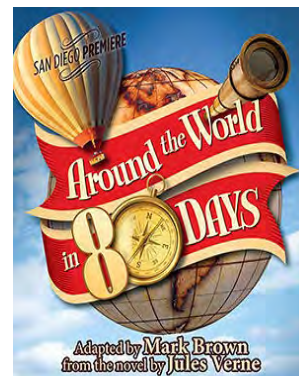
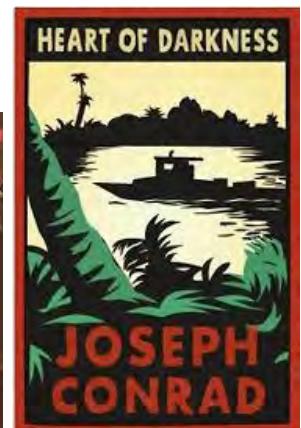

### Project update

September 2019

#### Working together

The Governors Centre project is jointly funded by the Sydney Boys High and Sydney Girls High school communities. School Infrastructure NSW is managing the governance and delivery of the project.

School Infrastructure NSW is delivering 190 new and upgraded schools for New South Wales. Bringing this experience to the Governors Centre project will help ensure value for money and high quality facilities for these school communities.

#### The Governors Centre

This exciting project will deliver a new performance and examination centre for Sydney Girls and Sydney Boys High Schools.

This project will deliver a modern three storey building incorporating:

- a theatre/auditorium for approximately 400 people
- an adaptable multi-purpose examination hall to seat 210 students
- external works and landscaping linking the two schools.

#### Progress summary

School Infrastructure NSW has been working closely with school stakeholders through the design of The Governors Centre.

Construction tenders have been assessed and the contract has been awarded to Stephen Edwards Constructions.

#### Next steps

Construction works for The Governors Centre are expected to begin in the coming months.

SINSW will work with the school and the contractor to ensure that the safety of students, staff and the community remains of paramount importance.

## CHS Athletics Wrap Up

Over the course of three days Wednesday 4th – Friday 6th September at SOPAC, twenty-four Sydney Boys High students competed against the best public-school athletes in the state.

Kane Shields and Ashwin Barrett both cruised through to the 800m finals, running 2:03.32 and 2:14.81 respectively. In their 800m finals, Ashwin ran a time of 2:15.10 to finish 8th in the 14s, and Kane ran a booming race to win gold in the 15s with 2:01.0 both times were fantastic, especially considering the 50 minute delay from scheduled race time. Kane also competed in a very tough race for the boys U15s 1500M final, with many lead changes and strange race tactics from certain competitors. Despite this adversity, Kane surged home to win the race by 0.1 seconds.

Our Under 12s 4x100m relay (Patrick Huang, Garry Liu, Stephen Li and Mahib Fazley) managed to finish 2nd in their heat and continued on to run a massive race winning a silver medal in the final! Their finishing time of 53.82 was only 0.24 seconds outside the school record set back in 2008. Fantastic effort boys!

Our 14s 4x100m relay (Nelson Cheng, Mahir Bhuiyan, Jack Yoon & Joshua Suto) managed to finish 1st in their heat, however they were unfortunately disqualified. Josh Suto did not let this get to him, as he ran a fantastic bend in his 200m heat, cruising through his race to run an amazing time of 23.73 to qualify for his final. This breaks the school record set in 2007 by 0.3 seconds, and Josh had plenty left in the tank when he crossed the line. He ended up coming 4th in the 14s boys 200m final in a time of 23.77. A very fast time considering he had already run 4 races prior over the previous two days. Joshua Suto jumped 6.03 in the 14 years long jump to finish in 3rd place. He then backed up his performance to run 53.28 in the 400m final to win GOLD!

Ethan Hybler kicked things off early in the 12s 80m hurdles, running 15.94 to qualify into the where he finished in 8th place running 15.48 seconds. Ethan was very happy with the result considering it was his first major comp. Caden Ma followed this up with a great time of 15.74 in the 15s hurdles final to finish 7th.

Rhys Shariff ran a PB time of 4:23.4 in a challenging race in the 16s 1500m to finish in 8th. Joshua Johnson finished

10th in the 17s triple jump. Frederick Huang finished 18th in the 13s boys shot put. Young gun Mahib Fazley ran a PB time of 13.50 in the 12s boys 100m heats despite having a shaky start out of blocks.

Rowan Tan finished 5th in the 15s triple jump after pulling out in round 1 due to an ongoing ankle issue. Rowan Tan ran a great time of 52.45 in the 400 heats but unfortunately has pulled out of the rest of the meet due to his ankle issue. We wish Rowan all the best with his recover and thank him for his ongoing commitment to the school athletics program.

The 15s boys 4x100m team (Chase Deep, Nathan Wang, Andrew Gu & Justin Lee Nonis) had a late change due to injury, but still performed well in their heat to qualify to the final in 7th. In their final the boys all stepped up their game and managed to finish 5th in a blanket finish, running 47.23.

[Raghav Ramanathan](#) jumped 1.85 in the opens high jump to take out a gold medal, but you wouldn't know considering his disappointment in his own performance. Prepare for a bomb to be dropped come GPS day.

Overall this was another successful outing at CHS. We are now in the long wait for points results to see if we have won the Kippax Cup again. Congratulations once again to all boys that competed.
