# SWIMMING SENSATIONS



The GPS swimming competition was well contested by High this season: Juniors 12-14 (3rd overall) and intermediate 15-16 (2nd overall). Darren Chien set a new GPS record in the 200m 17 years breaststroke at the GPS meet in late February, posting a time of 2:30:14. Our 14s and 15s put in another dominant performance with 5 wins. medal in the Government Schools division (and 7th overall in the All Schools division) against over one hundred school teams.




# TENNIS
