When we can count volleyball as an official sport I hope to see more victories. I believe strongly that first and second grade teams should train as a squad and compete with each other to share the GPS experience.

Recognition of the efforts of our second grade boys is well overdue. We have now mounted a GPS Second Grade Premiership Honour board in the bay to the right of the GPS premierships bay. Most of the teams involved have also had their photographs mounted around the board to give a context of faces to the teams painted in gold on it. I hope boys are inspired to try to get their team on the board in coming seasons.

Last Saturday (1/8/15), our junior fencers participated in the U13 School Championships Boys Team Foil event as well as the U13 ABC Series Foil, Sabre and Epee.

The U13 School Championships Team Foil event began early as usual at 8am, with our fencers all present at 7am to warm up. With poules completed last week, our A, B, C and D teams now fence elimination rounds according to rank. Facing off against top teams from traditionally tough competitors like St Aloysius and Sydney Grammar, the boys displayed the fine fruits of their hours spent in training. Across the board, there was a determination that set new heights for our school's foil fencing. Unfortunately, our B, C, and D team were eliminated before the final 4, but the A team (Owen Zhang, Joshua Zhao, Matthew Pellen and Aleksei Maksymow) grappled with the best of the competition for a medal that SBHS foil has been awaiting for a long time. Defeating Sydney Grammar B in the semi-final with a nail-biting 44-45 (Owen Zhang is to be commended for his intense effort in the final leg), SBHS U13 A team went against St Aloysius A in a bid for gold.

Though they secured an early lead, they unfortunately suffered from a difficult loss in the middle and were unable to recover. Nonetheless, they took away silver medals, managing to break a long foil podium dry spell for High. They are to be congratulated, and their brilliant performance is certainly indicative of talent and future heights to their fencing. During this, the U13 ABC Series competition ran parallel and offered our newest fencers in all three disciplines the opportunity to experience a competition environment. The opportunity they thoroughly embraced has provided them with the necessary confidence to take on their next competition.

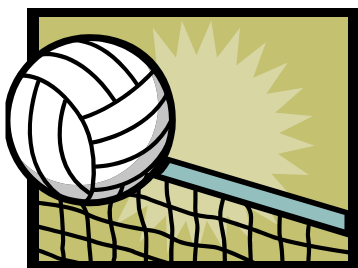
- You must turn up at least 45 minutes before the start of their match.
