



From the Principal High Talent

Dibyendu Roy (11E) and Kieran Shivakumaaran (11E) gained bronze medals in the recent invitation only Australian Mathematics Olympiad Competition – a very



strong achievement. Dharmesh Sharma (11S) came equal first in NSW in the Australian Geography

Competition. Great work Dharmesh! High was ranked number two in Australia in the same competition. Kai Matsumoto (12E) and Andrew McNaughton (12S) were presented with their John Lincoln Awards for Outstanding Service to the Community. Congratulations, boys! High boys received two Encore nominations for drama performances: Ellery Smith (12M) for his self-devised IP *No Dirt* and the GP *The Comedy Comrades Club*, by Ellery, Nelson Yin (12R) and James Merlo (12E). Congratulations to the boys for getting to the first benchmark and to Courtney Powell for her guidance and support.

CHS Athletics

High retained the Kippax Cup as the best athletics boys school at the CHS NSW carnival for the fourth consecutive year. David Chen (11T) won the 17+ long jump. Our boys won the 17+ 4x100 relay. Third place getters were: 4x100 13 years relay; 4x100 16 years relay; Matthew Moloney (8S) 14 years 1500m and Luke Schofield (12R) 17+ 3000m.

GPS Athletics Championships

U13 - Kazi Hasan (8S) won the 100m and 200m and came 3rd in the long jump. Rhys Shariff (7S) came 3rd in the 800m and 1500m. **U14** - Benjamin Nguyen (9F) won the long



jump and placed 2nd in the 100m hurdles; the 4x100m relay won and Matthew Moloney (8S) placed 2nd in the

1500m. **U15** – Pico Dos Santos-Lee (9T) placed 3rd in both the 100m hurdles and the long jump. **U16** – Clinton So (10E) placed 2rd in the110m hurdles with Eric Holstrom (9T) 3rd

in the 1500m. **U17** - David Chen (11T) won the 110m hurdles and the long jump. Luke Schofield (12R) won the 1500m and the 4x100m relay team placed 2nd. **Open** – Elias Hall came 3rd in the 400m; Luke Schofield placed 3rd in the 3000m and Jayden Schofield won the 800m Division.

In the Junior Division overall we placed 6th (2 points from TSC). In Intermediate Division we came 7th (1 point from SGS). In the Senior Division High placed 6th (14 points from SJC). It was a very busy week with the boys competing Wednesday-Saturday for CHS and GPS. The closeness of the margins between schools illustrates the need for in depth participation. It is vital that all events have competitors in them because everyone makes a significant contribution by earning points. Thank you to Kurt Rich and his coaches for the strong season of athletics they organised for our boys.

Valé Beryl Crockford 1950-2016



This week Beryl Crockford passed away as a result of the severe injuries she sustained when her bike collided with a car on Edwin Flack Avenue in Homebush on August 26. Beryl was Head Coach of rowing at High for several

years. In the 2015-16 season she coached the first VIII to its best Head of the River result since 2008. She represented Great Britain in rowing at three Olympic Games (1976-1984) and won a gold medal at the World Championships in 1985. She was a passionate advocate for her sport and for physical fitness and dedication to training. She was a force of nature who made a strong impression on all who came to know her. She will be sadly missed by the rowing fraternity and by our boys who rowed so well under her guidance.

Tournament of Minds

Tournament of Minds was held at Sydney Girls High on Sunday 28 August. As usual,

we entered three teams- one in Social Sciences category,

consisting of Lachlan Ho, Roshan Hossain, Jun Huang, Jivan Naganathan, Kevin Ton, Alan Wong and Alex Zhou and two language/literature teams: Andrey Avramenko, Ryan Borges, Alexander De Araujo, Ryan Jepson, Jesse Koslowski, Saarangan Arvind and Christian Lam and in the second team Arnav Bansal, Ozan Akarsu, Tejas Chaudhry, Varun Sharma, Etkin Tetik, Suvipra Vaidya and Ritchie Ah-Koon. The students have six weeks to develop 10-minute play scripts which present a solution to a problem specific to their discipline. They make props and costumes within a limited budget and they prepare for the second component of the challenge which is a spontaneous task, which is designed to gauge the extent to which they are effective as a team. A wonderful aspect of TOM is that it provides opportunities for students to work in a team with students from other year groups. The older boys mentor the younger and the spirit of collaboration when they are script building and creating props and costumes is inspiring. All of the performances were praiseworthy. We had full dress rehearsals from 8am on Sunday in 801 before their scheduled presentations in the afternoon. Thank you to Mr Aldous for supervising and for encouraging the students throughout the day. (Sadly, I was rostered onto the primary schools for judging and missed out on seeing the final performances.) Congratulations to all teams for working independently and for supporting each others' creativity.

Philosophy Discussion Group

This group has been meeting at lunchtime on Fridays through out term 3. We have welcomed Dr Aleks Wansborough, as our philosophy tutor for 2016. Aleks is Editorial Assistant for the Australasian Journal of Popular Culture and a PhD Candidate, Sydney College of the Arts/Sydney School of Contemporary Arts, University of Sydney. The communities of inquiry have been structured around the topics being explored on Wednesday 14 September at the annual Philosothon which is being hosted this year by St Andrew's Cathedral School. Junior Philosophy.

Recently our Year 9 English class was privileged to have Professor Karyn Lai conduct two small group workshop sessions about critical thinking and philosophy. She presented us with the main question, 'Why do we trust science over religion?' Throughout the workshops, she presented several questions to facilitate discussion, and we brainstormed our thoughts on butchers' paper. All of the ideas that were raised contributed to the bigger picture of science over religion. Through the science verses religion debate, we examined the uneasy relationship between science and religion, uncovering the differences between the two and the need for them to coexist. This conflict between the reverence for faith and scientific progress enlightened us to the importance of both of these fundamental cornerstones in our modern society. She expanded our critical thinking through this workshop session by allowing us to look at this topic from another angle. Overall, these philosophy sessions were memorable and immersive experiences which have offered invaluable insights into the intricacies between science and religion.'
