Refugee Week June 18-24



The Refugee Council of Australia has chosen "With courage let us all combine" as the theme for Refugee Week in Australia for 2017. Taken

from the second verse of the national anthem, the theme celebrates the courage of refugees and of people who speak out against persecution and injustice. It serves as a call for unity and for positive action, encouraging Australians to improve our nation's welcome for refugees and to acknowledge the skills and energy refugees bring to their new home.

Given the Government's recognition of its failures in its duty of care to refugees on Manus Island, reflected in its recent out of court settlement, we should all reflect on how well we as individuals treat refugees when we encounter them. Many live amongst us. More than 800,000 Australians were once refugees. As Australians and as international citizens, we ought to be concerned about the plight of refugees everywhere. There are more than 40,000,000 of them looking for refuge. Let's think of them and ask ourselves what gesture we could make to alleviate their plight.

Gymnasium Safety

Having been alerted to the issue of cars parking outside the gym doors and obstructing exit flows from the building, our GA Jim Crampton has painted 'No Parking' on the roadway to deter drivers. Meet the Prefect-Intern

'The ultimate ignorance is the rejection of something you know nothing about, yet refuse to investigate.' – Dr Wayne Dyer

I can still vividly remember walking into the school gates five years ago, facing the daunting prospect of high school. There were all sorts of pressures; pressure to participate, pressure to succeed, pressure to fit in. Fortunately, thanks to the unwavering support of my family and friends, I immersed myself in school culture and all the opportunities it has to offer, and I know that will have nothing but fond memories about my time at High.

However, looking back on my experiences, I realise that I never would have made it to where I am today without the

support of the people around me. What about the people who did not have the same guidance as me, the people who were rejected simply for being different? I began to notice things that I saw as insignificant before; casual statements, not intended to harm anybody, but which I realised could be highly demoralising to certain groups. I even began to notice myself saying things that had the potential to dishearten other people, whether intended harmlessly or not.



As the equality prefect, I'm trying to highlight the underlying assumptions, the false assumptions, that people make through these statements. And this is not just about school; these assumptions, if left unchallenged, will remain with people for the rest of their lives, and the influence of your words will only grow with time.

My final advice is to seize the chance to participate in the activities at High, and to take the opportunity to grow as a person through your experiences at high school. And with a culture of inclusion for everyone, regardless of gender, race, religion or sexuality, we can continue to have a culture that we are proud of at High.

Booking interviews with your son's teachers

This year we will again use a web based electronic scheduling system for arranging interviews. This produces better results for all participants, especially more compact time schedules for both parents and teachers. The system works as follows –

- On Tuesday 20 June all parents of boys in Years 8 and 10 were sent by email details of the scheduling system and a unique code to be entered at www.edval.com.au/book.
- This email was/will be sent to the address currently held by the school. If you have not received this email by the following day or, if your email address has changed from what had been previously advised to the school, you should notify the school at ptnight@sbhs.nsw.edu.au advising of this. Please indicate your son's name and roll class or date of birth so that the information can be forwarded to you.
- On the Edval website you will see your son's teachers listed and you will be able to select those with whom you require an interview. (If you hover over a teacher's name, the subject involved will be shown.) At the same time you can indicate your availability between 3:00 pm and 7:00 pm.
- Once the majority of parents have requested interviews, the overall schedule will be generated by the school and your individual schedule should be available for you to download and print from two days before the interviews.
- Periods will be shortened on the day of the interviews. Boys from all Years will be dismissed from class at 2:35pm on the day. School Special buses will run to normal schedules and there will be supervision available in the Junior Quad of boys waiting for these buses.
- *Interviews should not exceed five minutes' duration.* If there is insufficient time, a further appointment may be made for a later date, or contact by telephone arranged.

FROM THE JUNIOR LIBRARY

Our school libraries are rapidly becoming 24/7 libraries thanks to ebooks and ClickView

BOYS DO YOU KNOW ABOUT CLICKVIEW?

Our school's Library Fund donations from parents are paying approx. \$5500 for you to access movies and subject related DVD's. These resources can be viewed for revision, or just to learn about a subject you do not even take, *via the ClickView website from home*. You just need to put in your school email address and find a movie or DVD you would like to watch. If you have a smart TV your family can watch as well. Try a movie or two during the coming school holidays!

Staff might like to know that former W drive resources are called "SBHS legacy" in ClickView and you can put many of your faculty resources in as Subject resources, not Teacher only resources, so that students can use them for revision or self-education. Staff are also reminded that they might like to examine ClickView Exchange to see if they want to "add to library". This means our library staff will download and file the video so that it can be accessed by students. It will be filed in your faculty area.

Boys can find many subject related resources ClickView have put into the ClickView Library. Please have a look at ClickView Library so you have an idea about what you can find there.



HAVE WE GOT SOME GREAT NEW BOOKS FOR YOU? NEW EBOOKS AND NEW PAPER BOOKS!

Both our libraries have begun to put out the new paper based books we bought this year. These books have cost the two libraries approximately \$4000 so far this year from the parent donated library fund. See our new book displays and borrow immediately. Make sure you get a good supply in before the holidays.

The Junior Library has purchased OverDrive \$2600 ebooks ahead of time this year and these are now available to you on the OverDrive website via Oliver both at school and at home.

This particular OverDrive selection is biased towards Senior ebooks. Mrs Gordon selected these books on her Senior Library wish list. Both librarians are very pleased to have balanced our ebook collection for the use of both seniors and juniors. Seniors are reminded that they just put in their ID number to borrow any ebook and avoid putting in a pin. *You can browse rather than download* unless you are travelling. Both Wheelers and OverDrive have an app which makes downloading easier.



THE PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE- polish off the 20 books these holidays?

Years 7, 8 and 9's very good readers are reminded that the Premier's Reading Challenge opportunity for you will come up at the end of August. Proof of reading is required as the Librarian has to sign off on entries. This proof may be your loan record on Oliver, your loan record with both Wheeler's e books or OverDrive e books or your loan record at your local library emailed to library@sbhs.nsw.edu.au. Local libraries appear to have loan records available online.

The 20 books have to have been read from September last year to September this year so only books read in the last 12 months qualify you for entry into this quite difficult Challenge.

Please put your own entries into the Premier's Reading Challenge Website. In August, you will need to email the librarian to validate your entries. In that email please include your Proof of Reading – your loan records.

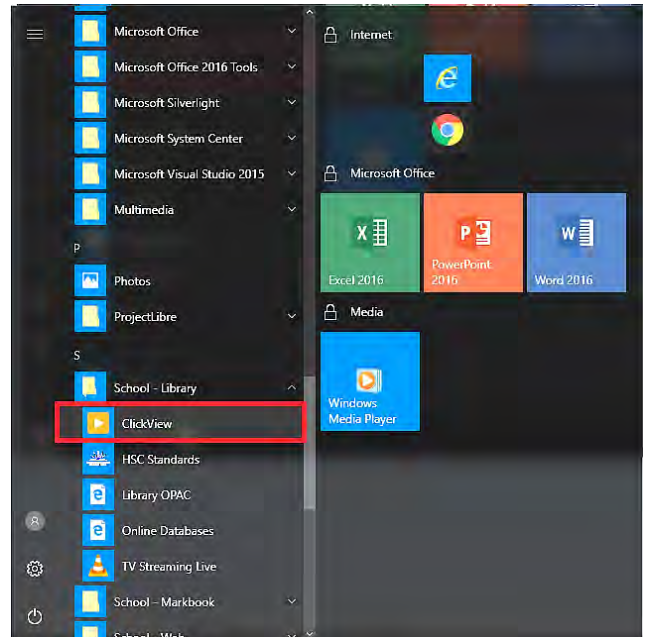
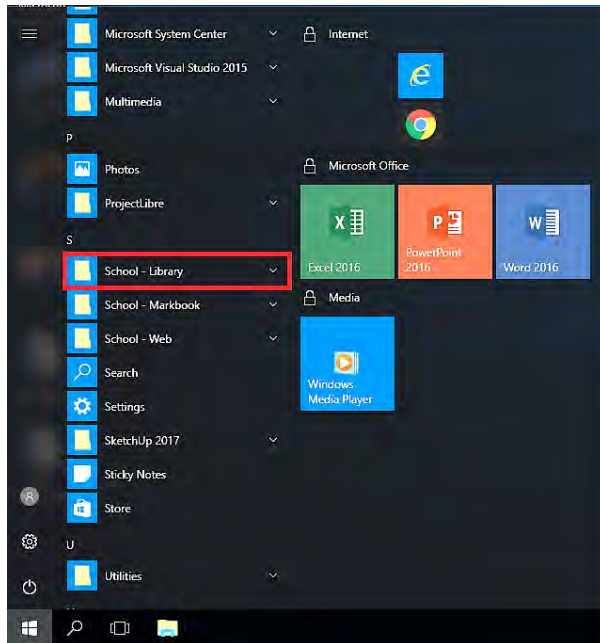
ClickView

To access this resource at school, login with your username and password on any school computer and go into the following directory:

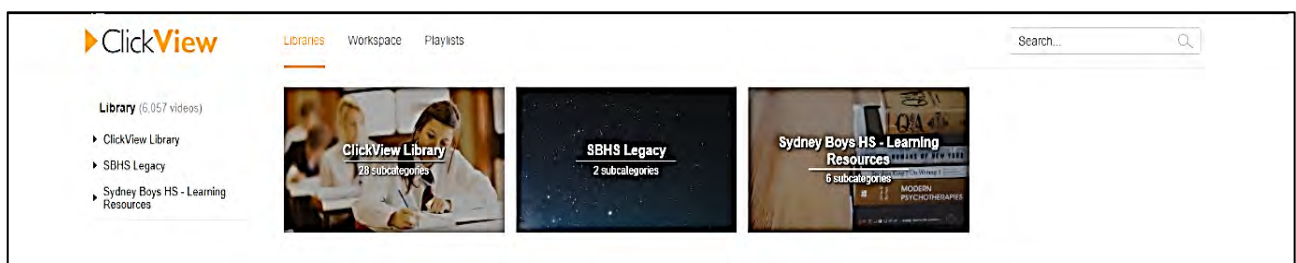
