Congratulations to our students Ben Kernohan (10S) and Etkin Tetkik (10E) who won the Australian National Robocup Open Rescue Competition. The boys will now represent Australia at the International competition in July next year. Very impressive, boys! Well done to Branko Stajic (11T), who won a medal in the UNSW Global - International Competitions and Assessments (ICAS) -English. At the Prime Minister's Prizes for Science ceremony, Associate Professor Jack Clegg (SHS-2000), The University of Queensland, was awarded the Malcolm McIntosh Prize for Physical Scientist of the Year, honouring his work making flexible crystals and new separation technologies. Ricky Pachon (SHS-2016) continues his great form, being crowned as Oceania Champion for a third year in a row. He was ranked No 1 in Australia by the Australian Brazilian Jiu-jitsu Federation (ABJJF), for 2017 & 2018. Congratulations, Ricky!



Summer Sport Co-payments: Term 4

The rolls for summer sports and activities have now been finalised. In many activities copayments are levied for the season – in this case Term 4 2018 and term 1, 2019. Other sports have a policy of fixing co-payments on a term-by-term basis. In either case, invoices

have now been posted. For years 7-10 this means that the summer invoice will be included on individual *Clearance Forms*. These will need to be cleared prior to boys receiving their reports. The base co-payment for sport for a season is \$160 for 2018-19, as adjusted for on costs. Higher charges are levied by individual sports as a result of resolutions passed by the Associations or P & C Support Groups responsible for supporting particular sports. Year 11 boys have been invoiced for term 4 or their full summer sport, too. It would help the MICs for these sports greatly if families could pay for their sports in the next ten days.

Boom gate



We have installed an automatically opening boom gate at Gate 10 on Anzac Parade. The purpose of the gate is to allow people on site after the cleaners have locked the gates to leave via gate 10. As they approach the gate in a car, the boom will lift. It has a hang time of fifteen seconds before it descends, allowing a couple of cars to pass below it. It can sense whether a car is directly underneath it and will not descend. The gate has a key lock to enable a parking supervisor to leave the boom up when they leave the site to allow patrons to exit without having to wait for the boom. We feel its installation will also allow staff not to have to rush out at six in fear of being locked in. It will be most beneficial when we have school functions at night to allow people to exit from the site at will.

Buzzers for staff to activate the boom gate both ways are available at a cost to the school below \$50 each. If this gate proves to be a success, we will move to install more of them on the site. We hope that we can secure Cutler Drive against through traffic and enhance student safety by having more boom gates. Set up costs will be high initially.

Transition to the new payroll system

I am asking for the forbearance of Managers in Charge and coaches during the next month. The transition of the school to the new HR SAP system is taking place during the next three pay periods. For the week ending Thursday, November 1 (for work from 26/10 to 1/11) timesheets need to be submitted in advance by Monday, October 29. Coaches need not worry about signing off on work not yet done on this occasion. The data will be entered on the current system. MICs will have to keep track of these pre-payments. For the week ending Thursday, November 8, authorised time sheets will have to be handed in by 0900 on Friday, 9/11. On that day, all pays will have to be processed by 1300. This is not going to happen given our large number of employees.

Inevitably, there will be delays in coaches receiving their pays. There is absolutely nothing we can say or do to change things, so let us work stoically together, to get through the difficulties ahead. Rest assured that our SASS people are doing everything they can to get you paid expeditiously.


If you require extended leave for your son exceeding four days, please apply in writing on the departmental

Debating Report



First XI Match Report

The First XI headed into the first trial match of the regular school term with weeks of pre-season behind us, eager to prove ourselves after an underwhelming display with the ball against St. Aloysius in the holidays. A quick relocation from St. Joseph's main ground at Hunter's Hill due to late, unforeseen circumstances, saw us play at High at the Main Oval of McKay. With overcast conditions above, we elected to bowl after winning the toss.

An uneven deck that is characteristic of a deteriorating McKay pitch saw Cameron Pereira (Year 11) take 2/14 and Nick Leong (Year 11) take 2-42 to leave St. Josephs reeling early at 3/39 at the drinks break (17 overs). This allowed for us to put pressure on St. Joseph's middle order, testing their temperament.

Unfortunately for us, Joey's First XI managed to turn the momentum in the game, with a defiant 4th wicket partnership, batting deep through the middle session of their batting innings.

Vivek Mahajan (Year 10) and Menuja Goonaratne (Year 10) finally got the breakthrough around the second drinks break, taking 2/23 and 3/12 respectively, and continuing in great form to clean up Joey's tail without a hassle. A wonderful effort lads to leave Joey's at 151 all out at lunch.

For us however, a batting top order collapse left us at 3-40 into our batting innings, a near identical situation to St. Josephs. Bilal Abbasi (Year 9) and Vivek Mahajan (Year 10), nevertheless, were stoic in their knocks this week, again playing an intentful but patient innings to swing back some much needed momentum for our team. Vivek's dismissal for 35 left us with 70 runs to win.

Juniors Bilal Abbasi and Josh Lau (Year 9) again dug deep, showing talent beyond their years to halve the required runs for victory.

Unfortunately, Josh's dismissal for 18 marked the end of our batting resistance, sparking another lower order collapse to leave us just 21 runs short of victory. We ended on 8/131 all out.

Second XI Match Report

The Second XI relocation to Moore Park West as a result of some complications at St. Josephs ground saw us play our first match as a unit on the synthetic pitch at Moore Park West 1. Overcast conditions, and some dew leftover from showers for the couple of days prior saw us win the toss and elect to bowl against St. Josephs.

This decision to bowl first played dividends for our team in the field. Subtle Breezes coming from the direction of the school played a significant role in aiding our opening quicks to take 2 wickets (Aleksei (Year 10) and Adi Srivatsan (Year 10)), whilst restricting Joeys to a measly 22 runs in the first passage of play (17 overs).

Further tight and consistent line and length by quicks Rohan Vashisht (Year 11) and Yatin Paditham (Year 11) who took 3/24 meant that Joeys weren't able to garner any real momentum with the bat throughout their innings.

Our energy in the field was a further highlight of the improved culture within the Second XI, with constant chatter and lively conversation allowing for High's fielding innings to be played with positive intent.

As a result of this, Joey's could only manage a total of 109 all out. A wonderful effort considering the relatively small boundaries of MPW 1 and the even, hard characteristics of synthetic style pitches.

However, we learnt the hard way that a fielding innings is only half done. Going into the second innings with high hopes, the Second XI started extremely positively, with opener Adi Srivatsan managing a strong 46 runs in his debut innings for the Seconds.

A strong batting of 2/66 chasing 109 with 20 overs remaining, saw us with victory in our sights. However, momentum was dramatically halted, with a collapse of monumental proportions saw us lose 8/18 in the late middle session, allowing us to be bowled out for 84.

This match has been a tough match, but one in which as a team we will regroup, look at our weaknesses and reevaluate for the last trial match before the regular season begins against St. Ignatius in Week 3 of Term 4.
