Staff Changes

Ms Rachel Powell has been appointed Principal of James Ruse Agricultural High school. On behalf of the wider school community I extend to her our congratulations. Rachel had a transformative impact on our school in her years as HT History and Deputy Principal and MIC Debating. Her principal contributions were in formative assessment, collaborative professional learning. professional development plans, lesson observations, dispositional teaching, student orientation and transition, social justice and gender equality, indigenous education and inclusivity. Learning spaces for students were re-imagined under her leadership. In debating, a state level CHS or GPS trophy was claimed every year she managed the program, which grew to > 200 student participants. I admired her courage and the manner in which she cared enough to confront people about their professional and personal behaviour. She will thrive in the Principal's role. Mr Peter Loizou is relieving Deputy Principal Junior School for term 1. Mr Tom Dolan is relieving HT Social Science for term 1.Pursuant to a School Council approved resolution, Mr John Prorellis has been appointed as casual Deputy Principal Administration for 2019. Ms Julie Eggleton is relieving HT English for 2019 as Mr Cinquetti is on leave. Our best wishes are extended to our long serving and much-admired teacher, Mr Mark Gainford, who is recovering in hospital after major surgery involving an amputation of his leg. Ms Hyminn Chan is his replacement for term 1. John James is relieving in mathematics for various leave vacancies. Jeremy Ohlback returns to the English faculty, replacing Sherrin Ayre, who is on leave.

High Talent

Holidays Properties Changes

Over the Christmas holiday period a tremendous amount of painting work has been completed by contractors for the Department of Education. I am very pleased that the original 1928 building, the Great Hall and the



1963 Killip Wing have been painted internally for the first time since I was appointed Principal at High. I addition, staff offices, classrooms and the administration corridor have been completed. The cloisters and outside of the Great Hall will be finished in the next couple of weeks. This major financial commitment by DoE, along with the 2018 recarpeting project, has given the school a real facelift, making it much like its original appearance. The huge investment in our school is very much appreciated by the wider school community.



Weights Room for 2019

High's weights room offers exceptional value for money. The room has appropriate equipment for preparing the bodies of teenage boys and crucially, it is constantly supervised. When handling weights, technique is vitally important and boys need to learn the correct way to lift. Kurt Rich, our Head Strength and Conditioning Coach, is a well-credentialed and experienced trainer. His presence ensures that the boys are training safely and sensibly. So as well as getting gym facilities, clients have a supervisor and adviser to help them during their unlimited visits. The Weights Room operates much more effectively if all boys get their training in how to use the various pieces of equipment and in proper lifting technique, as soon as possible. Kurt Rich provides this service at the beginning of each year and can tailor individual programs for members after the introductory sessions. Having a fixed clientele makes his job more productive and leads to a better training experience for members and better strength outcomes for participants. Hence, we decided to close off memberships by the end of February each year. Boys who have not paid by that time can no longer attend the weights room.

Costs for this service are held down to a minimum and reduced by boys taking out a full year's membership. For 2019, a full year Weights Room membership costs just \$252. Boys wishing to have full year membership must register and pay by Thursday, February 28, 2019. There will be no extensions of time nor another window of opportunity later in the year if you forget to pay on time.

Early Bird Discounts

In order to help all areas of the school we offer a substantial discount to parents who pay all their invoices in full before Thursday, February, 28. It is not only a great demonstration by them of their commitment to the ethos of the school but also it's an encouragement for others to follow their lead and it helps to create a critical mass of financial support for our programs. The annual cash contribution by the DOE finances less than



one quarter of our programs at High. The rest comes from the support of parents and the efforts made by School Family volunteers, helping in fund raising. Having substantial funds early in the year allows us to make sure that capital works are completed in the holidays, orders are made promptly and that the boys get the maximum benefit out of equipment and services deployed for them this year. Quality services, extra staff and high standards come at a high price. A very large number of parents see the package as value for money and contribute in full.

The discounts for 2019 are- Junior school \$200 and Senior School \$205. The early bird discount is available for students who were invoiced in December, 2018 or later and doesn't apply to students who were invoiced in October, 2018 and subsequently came to Orientation Day in November and had the opportunity to pay everything on the day and obtain the discount. Year 7, 9 or 11 boys who were **not** made offers before Orientation Day are eligible for the discount. Students in Years 8-12 have the chance to make a saving by paying in full by **Thursday 28 February**.

From the Outgoing Deputy Principal

I have been lucky enough to be given the Principal position at James Ruse Agricultural High School. As some of you know this is the result of one year's hard effort, applying for nine positions and honing my application to suit the often-conflicting feedback given to me by panels and colleagues.



I leave Sydney Boys High School after nine years first as Head of History and then as Deputy Principal. have thoroughly enjoyed my time at High and have been extremely lucky to have worked with such a wonderfully generous such staff. committed parents and such amazing students. I will really miss all of you.



As Deputy Principal, I am proud of work that has been achieved in many key areas. I don't seek to claim credit for all of it, but I do feel that I have played a part in some of it and I am confident that with so many committed and hardworking staff, the school will keep evolving after I leave. There are many staff who have been instrumental in the changes that I will speak about, but I don't want to name any of you for fear of missing one person out. I hope that along the way I have given due thanks and praise to those of you who I have worked with over the last nine years.

In particular I know that SBHS is a more inclusive school than it was ten years ago: the equality team, on line reporting or racism and homophobia, the anti-bullying work, the assemblies for Sorry Day, IDAHOT and International Women's Day, Wear it Purple Day, the move from *Master* in Charge to *Manager* in Charge and the move to remove gender bias in staffing roles at the carnivals are all seemingly small changes but together they reflect a cultural shift at High of which I am very proud.

I am happy that with the development of thinking routines and PEWCC skills, teaching and learning at High is becoming more student focused and that student engagement is greater than it was when I arrived – both in History and across the school.

I feel like what we have achieved with our professional learning with the administration, the smooth transition to and the gaining of accredited hours for school staff development such as PLEs has allowed us to transition to the new world of PDPs and to eTAMS more smoothly than other schools. I would like to think that the collaborative staff development days between us and SGHS continues to help build improved relationships for staff and students.

Leading a range of teams has also been a real joy for me and I encourage all teachers to engage with one of the teams. The cyber management, quality teaching and antibullying teams have made a real difference to areas of school life and it is has been really enjoyable working with staff across faculties. One of my regrets at leaving will be not be being able to work with the Literacy Team who have got some great plans to move literacy forward in 2019.

Finally, for someone who had never even watched a debate before I arrived at SBHS, I think I did a pretty good job of running the program as both a highly inclusive and highly competitive one. Some of my best memories are of seeing ex- students spending hours with their new teams. I remember clearly watching Khushal Vyas, who I had taught for two years as a Modern History Student and who I had driven around to each debate for PDC in Year 12, giving feedback to his Year 7 team after their first Friday debate and I could not have felt prouder. The old boy coaching model is very special and unique to High and it exemplifies 'You can't buy High Spirit' which is the sense of pride we have about working and studying at High. Although, I will welcome getting my Friday nights back, I will absolutely miss the camaraderie, the competition and the commitment shown by all of those in the debating program. I did say I would retire when we won the triple though so now I am keeping my word!



I am eternally grateful to Dr Jaggar for giving me the opportunity to work at High. Kim is by the far the best Principal I have worked for. He is generous and funny. He is the cleverest person I know: a great mind, a deep thinker, a big thinker, a futures thinker. Characteristically his ability to listen carefully and understand new ideas and concepts very quickly and very deeply, allowed him to see beyond my lack of NSW experience and to see that I had skills and knowledge that would suit the staff and students in the History Faculty at High. He has time for the big picture and the fine detail. He has spent hours and

hours helping me to develop my skills in preparation to be Principal.

He has instilled me with a sense of confidence in my own abilities and has provided me with full support at every step of the way. When Kim offered me the position of Deputy Principal (DP) he said, "Just do 3-4 years as DP and then you should apply for principal positions." Now some of you might think it sounded like he was trying to get rid of me, but to me I was just pleased that he thought so highly of me as to even suggest such a plan.

I would like to publicly thank Kim for being so supportive and inspirational and say that if, in the future, I can contribute fifty percent of the time, commitment, passion, thought and energy to public education that he does, then I will be very proud of my achievements.

It is ironic that the painting of the school (which was one of my goals when I became DP) is almost complete as I leave. I am happy to see that High will be restored to its former glory but sad to leave my beautiful office as it will look so stunning.

However, I know that life is much more than bricks and mortar. It is relationships that make life worth living and it is the relationships that I have formed with the students, staff and parents at SBHS that I will cherish for years to come.

Peer Mentoring Program @ High

Belong | Inspire | Grow

Recruiting Year 8 Peer Mentees!



This is a new program started last year. The rationale behind this program is to:

- Provide growth and learning opportunities for both mentors and mentees, nurturing the importance of peer relationships for adolescents.
- Capitalising existing resources at High: existing students at High have the first-hand experiences to mentor the younger students due to the unique nature of SBHS.
- Older mentor (Year 10) is matched with a younger student (Year 8) for the purpose of guiding and supporting the mentee in the development of areas such as;
 - -academic (academic resilience, study skills, subject selection),
 - -social (social media, friendship) and
 - -emotional (family dynamic, help seeking behaviour)

Some of the benefits for Peer Mentees are:

- Connectedness to school and peers
- Feelings of competency and self-efficacy
- Academic improvement
- Prosocial behaviour and attitudes

Students will meet for six sessions during the Year 8 Values Education classes in Term 2 and 3. The ratio of mentor to mentee is roughly one mentor to two or three mentees. Students will go through a workbook (designed by student mentors). This is like a scaled down version of Peer Support. It is a small group and intentional meeting. The idea is that students will grow their friendship (like big brothers) beyond the six sessions.

The feedback from the peer mentors and mentees in 2018 were:

- On a scale of 1-5, how do you rate your peer mentoring experience?
 - 3 out of 42 students said 3 and 39 students said 4 and above.
- How to rate the peer mentoring program (the actual program)?
 - 1 student said 2.5, 8 out of 42 students said 3 and 33 said 4 and above.
- Did peer mentoring meet your expectations? 20 out of 42 students TOTALLY, 19 MOSTLY and 3 SOMEWHAT
