## Olympic Day Celebration



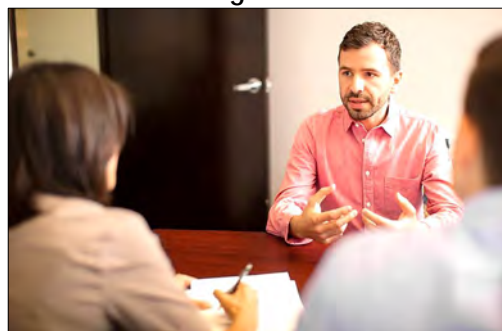
Anthony Vlatko (12F) was a member of the Australian Athletics Team at the Youth Olympic Games held last October in Buenos Aires, Argentina. He made the final of the 800m. At a special ceremony held in the Junior Library last Thursday, on behalf of the school, he was presented with an Olympic flag by an Olympian from the AOC, Rohan Chapman-Davies, a competitor in mogul skiing at the winter Olympic Games held at PyeongChang, South Korea last year. The ceremony was one of many held in schools to promote Olympic Day that was celebrated on Sunday 23 June. The first such day was held in 1948, at the instigation of the IOC President at the time. Its purpose is to promote the spirit of the Olympics in young people. The day celebrates getting active and living the Olympic values. ## Interpreting Year 11 Reports - Semester One

Year 11 parents should be aware that the information, upon which the first semester report marks are based, might be a measure of just one or two skill sets or a limited number of completed topics. Individual marks for courses supplied by teachers are recorded and run

against an ATAR predictor program. All the raw marks are converted into scaled marks per unit. In the iterative scaling process, students' marks in one course are compared against all the other students who completed the same course and against their performances in their other courses. The data we use are last year's HSC results for High. We shape current data, in terms of means and standard deviations, against the previous year's actual HSC data. The essential comparative assumption is that students will perform at around the same standard as a cohort this year, as they did last year. A scaled score out of 50 is calculated for each course on a one-unit basis. Any student missing a task or studying a course outside the school is given the average per unit of their other courses, instead of missing the values altogether. We use all 12 Preliminary Units to calculate our High ATAR estimate, for two reasons. First, we would like students to receive a realistic appraisal of their progress in state terms as well as relative to their peers at High. Second, we want them to know their relative performance in each of their courses. Students can use this data later in the year to make decisions about which courses to continue or terminate. Their choices are restricted, given that 12 Preliminary units can only be reduced to ten for the HSC or eight if an accelerant performed well.

## Parent-Teacher Night Years 7 & 8



This week our parent-teacher evening for stage four students was very well attended. All appointments are scheduled between 1500 and 1900 – the period of time our teachers are available. Our program that allocates appointments was designed by professionals and has been tested in many school settings. It does its best to schedule as many interviews for parents as it can, within the constraints of the time that parents have indicated that they are

available. Certain teachers, particularly in music, visual arts and design and technology, have multiple classes in Years 7 & 8 and so making time for all parents is very difficult. If parents have not been able to see all their sons' teachers in person, but would like to make contact with them, telephone interviews or personal interviews may be arranged, depending on the availability of the teachers concerned. **Booking interviews with your son's teachers**

This year we will again use a web based electronic scheduling system for arranging interviews. This produces better results for all participants, especially more compact time schedules for both parents and teachers. The system works as follows –

- On Tuesday 23 July all parents of boys in Years 10 and 11 will be sent by email details of the scheduling system and a unique code to be entered at <https://spring.edval.education> .
- This email will be sent to the address currently held by the school. If you have not received this email by Wednesday 24 July or if your email address has changed from what had been previously advised to the school, you should notify the school at [ptnight@sbhs.nsw.edu.au](mailto:ptnight@sbhs.nsw.edu.au) advising of this. Please indicate your son's name and roll class or date of birth so that the information can be forwarded to you.
- On the Edval website you will see your son's teachers listed and you will be able to select those with whom you would like an interview. (If you hover over a teacher's name, the subject involved will be shown.) At the same time you can indicate your availability between 3:00 pm and 7:00 pm. You should provide this information **by 6pm on Thursday 25 July**.
- The overall schedule will be generated by the school and your individual schedule should be available for you to download and print from Friday 26 July.
- Periods will be shortened on the day of the interviews. Boys from all Years will be dismissed from class at 2:35pm. School Special buses will run to normal schedules and there will be supervision available in the Junior Quad of boys waiting for these buses.
- *Interviews should not exceed five minutes' duration.* If there is insufficient time, a further appointment may be made for a later date, or contact by telephone arranged.

## Race Report: St Joseph's Invitational

Last Saturday, the High teams competed at North Ryde Common. The races were over a shorter, flatter and faster course than usual that ran around the outside of the park. It was a great day for running with beautiful weather, and we thank St Joseph's College for hosting the event.

### Under Fourteen

The Under Fourteen team made a massive improvement on their previous performances; out of nineteen runners, fifteen ran personal bests. Among these were Declan Wong and Timothy Arsecularatne, who ran strongly, as usual, to place twelfth and thirteenth in the GPS. With the rest of the team very close behind, the Fourteens are developing excellent depth towards the end of the season.

### Under Sixteen

Our Under Sixteen team ran well on the course, coming 3<sup>rd</sup> out of the GPS schools and 4<sup>th</sup> overall – a hefty improvement of 32 points on our previous result of 124 points in the overall rankings.
