High's depth was highlighted by premiership wins in 3rd grade, 16As, 15As, 15Bs and 14Bs. Congratulations to all players and their coaches! Back to McKay Day

Our team had to settle for second in the open GPS competition, behind SGS. For the first and second XI football matches against Grammar, a heartening number of spectators spread along both

IT Pedagogical Skills Leader and CANVAS Learning Management System



CANVAS advanced is an Learning Management System used in many schools and universities. It has all the functions of MOODLE but adds more interactivity to the platform along with hosting other applications. High will be moving onto the CANVAS platform during the next 12 months. Our ICT will drive the systems and software. To embed the system into teaching and learning, we have employed Mr Brett Jackson from our Social Science faculty as our Pedagogical Skills Leader. His role will be to liaise with teachers and the IT staff to integrate elements of the platform into teaching and learning programs and classroom pedagogy. He will be supported by Faculty Leads, who will be the champions of the transition to the new platform within their faculties. With subscription fees, training, professional support and allowances, this exercise in pedagogical enhancement will require an investment of c\$30k over the next twelve months. Our determination is to provide all the resources necessary to make this change impactful on learning outcomes.

Student Leave Requests

Too many parents are ignoring or pleading ignorance about the school policy on **Student Leave of Absence – Extended Leave Travel** requests. This applies to leave that is **five school days or more** in duration. Parents are reminded that as a matter of policy leave will not be processed or approved unless **four weeks**' notice has been given. Also, cogent reasons for travelling during school term need to be supplied. The effect of this decision is that all leave requests that involve that last four weeks of term must be lodged with me for approval by the end of week 6, each term. If you are planning to travel during the school term you need to download, complete and submit the form for my approval by the closing date.



Year 10 Camp 2019

Year 10 Camp is happening again!!! What a fantastic way to finish the year on a HIGH and make some lifelong memories! Notes were handed out last term. Spare copies can be printed out from R:\School Admin\Outdoor Education\Year 10 Camps.



Students attending camp will work in small groups, of their choice, to successfully complete a 5-day, journey based program. There would be 3 grades of difficulty, each following a different navigation line. The boys, under the

guidance of the OEG and SBHS staff members, would be responsible for navigating their way from the drop off point to where they will be picked up 5 days later. They will be carrying their own equipment (provided by OEG) and be responsible for preparing all their own meals. During the journey, the boys would be undertaking team initiatives, raft building and catapult challenges. There will also be night activities including a first aid scenario and a "Pot Roast Cook-off".

This is a once in a lifetime experience that the boys should not miss. They won't have another opportunity to spend a week with their mates, in the bush, developing life skills and creating memories they will be talking about long after school has finished.

For those students completing the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, this program meets the requirements for the Silver Practice Expedition and the Silver Qualifying Expedition. This means that boys will not need to go on any additional expeditions to meet the requirements for the Silver Award.

The cost of the program includes transport to and from camp, use of tents, backpacks, sleeping mats, wet weather gear (if needed), cooking equipment, all food (and heaps of it), a qualified OEG leader per group and specialist support leaders working behind the scene. This cost has been subsidised by the school and is excellent value for money.

Those students who choose to remain at school will attend **normal timetabled classes**.

BOGGABILLA 2019

In the final week of Term 2, our group of 24 students embarked on a 10-hour bus trip to the small, rural Indigenous community of Boggabilla, located right on the border of NSW and Queensland. Over the next 4 days, we would live, learn and interact with an entirely new and unique culture, all while connecting with the wonderful students from Boggabilla Central School.



We arrived on Monday at the riverside campsite of Bondi, where we were able to stretch our legs after the long drive. For some of us, camping in the bush was a new experience, but throughout the afternoon we all became accustomed to the campsite, thanks to the fantastic help of the Boggabilla students and teachers. The act of passing a football was all it took to break the ice between the High and Boggabilla students, as this allowed us to individually introduce ourselves to the students. After setting up our tents, we were treated to a barbeque which consisted of sausages, steak, and marshmallows.

The second day brought us many new learning experiences such as fishing and a competitive touch footy game against the school. Both teams played with exceptional spirit but Sydney Boys eventually prevailed. The scorching heat escorted us into the school where we explored their facilities and played a few more basketball games in their main hall. We concluded the day with a short bus ride to a nearby Town called Toomelah, where we learned about the cultural significance of its canoe tree.

The third day was dedicated to celebrating NAIDOC week. We were invited to join the school's NAIDOC day where we watched an assembly to commemorate and talk about NAIDOC week and its significance to the Indigenous people. It was fantastic to see community members gather from nearby towns like Goondiwindi to



take part in this event. Following the assembly were various activities such as face painting, boomerang designing and a mini trivia quiz that rewarded us with many exciting prizes. The day ended on a short drive up to Goondiwindi in Queensland to stock up on rations and souvenirs. A special night session with Buddy Hippi, an Indigenous mentor of cultural song and dance, gave us the chance to immerse ourselves in a few Indigenous dances, and helped us to understand how star constellations relate to Indigenous stories.



The final day involved a quick sweep of our belongings before we headed back to Sydney. Overall, the Boggabilla exchange was an exciting and insightful experience for all of us. The numerous days we spent there gave us a unique opportunity to actively engage with Indigenous culture. Of course, all of this wouldn't have been possible without the incredible help of Mr. Cotton and Mr. Barris in organising this eventful excursion. This was a once in a lifetime trip that will stay memorable to us.


