I trust everyone managed some relaxation and family time during the vacation period. We are still quite a time away from resuming a nearly normal school routine. Precautions will continue. More PPE will be made available to staff. Procedures will be modified to avoid non-staff contact with our students. We welcome John James into the Mathematics Faculty, replacing Taryn Evans who was appointed to Caringbah High from the beginning of this term. Taryn made a significant contribution to curriculum, co-curricular activities and school administration in her decade and a half at High teaching mathematics.

Capital Works During the Holidays

The Sydney High School Foundation Building Fund has supplied the funds for the next stage in the ongoing classroom technology upgrade, completed in the vacation at a cost exceeding \$95k. Rooms 202-205, 207-209 and 801 have had the full upgrade - projection and writing whiteboards and smart projectors with control panel. In addition, ten rooms had their blinds replaced at a cost of \$18k. The great support we get from parents in contributing to the taxdeductible fund enables us to undertake these major projects to improve the learning and teaching environment. The more time on task, the more outcomes that can be achieved.

Movement on School Grounds

The COVID-19 public health situation is still uncertain. Restriction of various kinds may be imposed and/or eased at various stages during term three. We are restricting our planning to the end of August at this stage. We appreciate that many parents, following the Minister for Transport's advice, will want to drive their sons to school. During term two, we tried to help students and their parents by employing parking attendants from school funds to manage traffic movements on site. Deputy Principal Jamie Kay and Head Teacher Teaching and Learning, George Barris, were on site frequently to assist with the traffic flow. We sent SASS staff home early to ease congestion. We negotiated access to Moore Park to allow drop-offs near the light rail station. We painted traffic flow lines and limits on the driveways. Gradually, parents understood and followed directions. The site was cleared within 25 minutes each afternoon. Mornings were a little slower as students arrived at varying times.

Such a high level of financial resourcing to assist traffic flow at two critical times each day is not sustainable indefinitely. For the beginning of term three, on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays, we will have two parking attendants on duty in the morning and afternoon to assist with traffic flow. On Wednesdays and Thursdays, we will have the attendants for mornings only. This service will be reviewed after two weeks.



On **Tuesday afternoon**, there will be **no right turn from Cleveland Street into school grounds from 3:10 until 3:30.** Congestion is worsened by cars trying to turn off Cleveland Street while cars are trying to turn right into it. Please enter via gate one with a left turn. From 3:10 cars entering Gate 1 will be directed to the Junior Quad until the bus lines clear at 3:25 and then exit will be available via Cutler Drive Gate 10. The cars gathered on The Flat will have priority exit from Gate 2 from 3:10 until 3:30.

Safe, Responsible and Respectful Use of Digital Technology.

Our children and young people have grown up with digital technology and it is woven into their lives. During COVID -19 many young people are using digital technology more often to learn and to socialise.

Supporting children and young people to use technology in a safe, respectful and responsible manner allows for more active online learning that can increase student engagement and participation. It also supports access to a broader range of content and learning resources that can supplement students' learning experiences.

Being safe online is a shared responsibility for students, teachers, parents, carers and the broader community.

It is important that families can communicate with their children about the how to use digital technology in safe, responsible and respectful ways.

Here are some key reminders for children and young people of how to stay safe online:

- Protect personal information, including name, address, school, email address, telephone number, pictures and other personal details.
- Never share user names or passwords and only use your own
- Ask a teacher or other responsible adult for help if anyone online asks for personal information, wants to meet or offers money or gifts.
- Let a teacher or other responsible adult know immediately if anything online that is suspicious, harmful or inappropriate.
- Never hack, disable or bypass any hardware or software security, including any virus protection, spam and filter

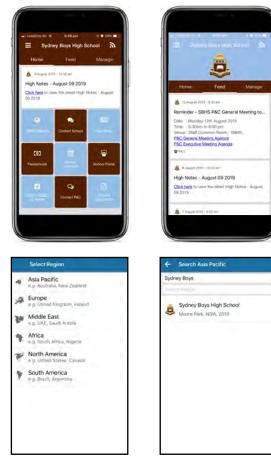

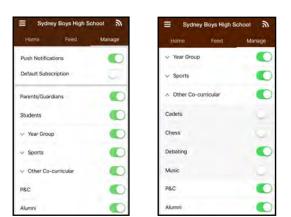

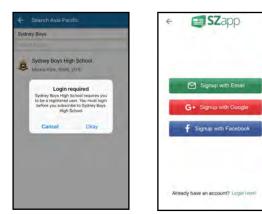
