Please note; If you have changed your name (eg. after marriage), please also submit your Change of Name Certificate.

FROM THE JUNIOR LIBRARY CORONAVIRUS IS A VEXED ISSUE IN HIGH USE AREAS LIKE LIBRARIES

Many thanks to the thoughtful parent donor of the temperature checker which has been installed at the entrance to the Junior Library. The boys have been intrigued and are checking their temperatures several times a day!



Every boy who comes into the Library is reminded to hand sanitise and pre-wipe his own chair and his immediate reading area.



It was lovely to see parents recognise that 38,000 boys use our library in every 6-month period so spreading infection is a very vexed issue in such a high use area. These difficulties are compounded by the fact that in libraries students straggle in. They do not come in at the beginning of every period like a class where they can be addressed as just one group.

The only way to try to guarantee clean surfaces where there is continuous use of spaces 8 times a day (counting break times) is for students to clean their own areas. Big thanks to our High boys who automatically wipe their areas, bin their wipes and who put up with the Librarian and the Library assistants sounding like broken records. It is a pleasure to work with such compliant people.



A reminder that the photocopier/printer which is touched by so many different people would be a wonderful way for the virus to spread – please continue to pre-wipe it before touching the keys.

Unfortunately, we all need to keep this high standard of cleanliness up until we have no virus. The virus has not burnt out yet.

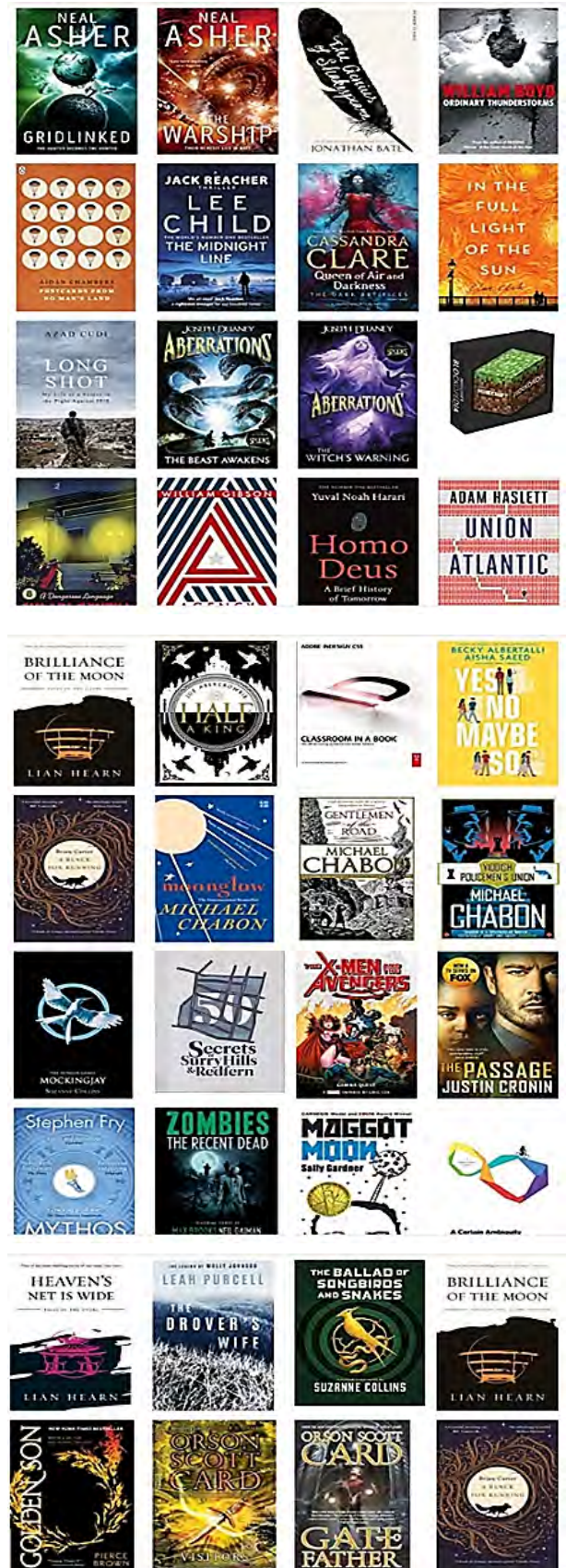


STUDENT ART IN JUNIOR LIBRARY

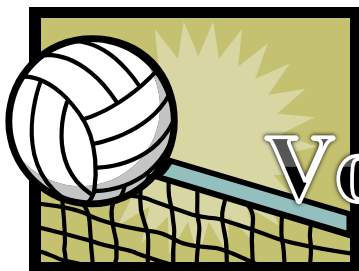
