This year the process was smoother than ever and the cooperation level from the students was very high. It added depth, uniqueness and personality to the content of the references. It made my job a lot easier as the writer. The note must contain the student's name, ID number, roll class, date, time of departure and reason for leave. The student then returns to the office at the stated time and collects an early leave pass.






Outdoor Education is starting up again!

The aim of Year 10 camps is to provide a challenging wilderness experience to further develop leadership skills, promote positive risk taking, environmental awareness and safe practices.

Students who complete all 4 camps (or 2 if they come in Year 9) are awarded an Outdoor Education Certificate for their portfolio and can include Outdoor Education in their Year 12 reference letters; something all universities hold in high esteem.

Below is a recount from last year's camp by the 2021 School Captain, Jivan Naganathan.

The Year 10 Outdoor Education Camp proved to be extremely worthwhile and unique for all the boys that participated in it. We spent five days in the third last week of the school year at Bush Camp Biloela in Bangadilly National Park, with half the group tackling their Bronze and Silver level expeditions for the Duke of Edinburgh Award and with many more coming along just for an enjoyable experience. In the days leading up to the camp, we ensured that we carefully planned our journey, including navigation, food and supplies. This allowed us to take a much more hands-on and selfdirected approach during our adventure. We led hikes and cooked meals during the day and played competitive capture-the-flag in the evening with the local kangaroos watching from only a few metres away. With assistance from Mr Fuller, Mr The, Ms Ibbott and the Outdoor Education Group leaders we were able to learn about Australia's very own backyard and our own minds, while getting away



from the usual classroom, strengthening friendships and forming new ones. The experience as a whole was a great adventure for us all. It broke through expectations by taking us well out of our comfort zones and by pushing us to limits that we had never


been pushed to before, building valuable character for when we returned to school. Jivan Naganathan 11R
